
***** Connection

Activities: What will we be doing?

To improve in a language, you will need to use it as much as possible in a variety of ways. We are also going to develop the other standards too (cultures, communities, connections, comparisons). Here are some of the main ways we will use it in class:

- **Conversations** Challenge yourself to use Spanish as much as possible during class.
- ❖ In-class Experiences There will be lots of "trying" in this class including anything from music to art to conversations with new people.
- **Projects/Independent Research** Your new knowledge and expertise will be an important part to share with the class.

Assessing: What's my grading going to look like?

Grading policy - in Spanish, students will receive two kinds of grades: effort and achievement grades.

- **Effort Grading** This will be 30% of your overall grade
 - Effort grades are assignments that students complete regularly like classwork or homework.

Type of Assignment	O (Outstanding)	S (Satisfactory)	M (Minimal)	U (Unsatisfactory)	Missing or blank
Homework	10	8.5	7.5	6	0
Small CW	20	17	15	12	11

- Small classwork assignments are Do Nows, Speaking Practice, and other small written assignments.
- Students should plan to attend office hours in order to retrieve missing assignments.
- ❖ Achievement Grading This will be 70% of your overall grade
 - Achievement grades are assignments that occur intermittently throughout the semester in order to assess whether a student has learned a concept or skill such as an essay, test or project.

Type of Assignment	Grade on assessment	Missing or largely incomplete	
Large (200 points)	Achievement grades will be given a grade	Any missing or incomplete achievement grades will receive a grade of 45%.	
Small (50 points)	between 100% and 45%.
