Ainsworth (CAP) Comprehensive Achievement Plan Indicators:

District and School Climate and Culture 1.4 - School staff identify students who need additional learning time to meet standards and provides timely and effective programs of assistance.

Educator Effectiveness 2.2 - All teachers use instructional strategies and initiatives that are grounded in evidence-based practices, strengthen the core academic program, increase the quality and quantity of learning time, and address the learning needs of all students.

Family and Community Involvement 3.4 - School staff educate families and provide needed resources for supporting their children's learning.

*Teaching & Learning 4.1 - All instructional staff at the school are engaged in aligning instruction and local assessments to state standards.

- Comprehensive Achievement Plan
 - Reviewed 3 CAP indicators
 - Talked about the goals and how we are making progress with those goals
 - 3rd grade teacher shared that PLC for her grade level have been effectively implemented
 - o Colby asked if we will replace an indicator and we clarified that it'll be an additional indicator
- Staffing
 - Kris explained the staffing spreadsheet
 - We talked about All Hands Raised and how 1/3rd goes into the equity fund
 - K, 28 students, 1-2nd is 30, and in 3-5th is 34 students as the threshold for EA
 - Went over the Core Program minutes
 - Shared about the Foundation position cuts and explained the roles
 - o Explained that PTA used to pay for Tech because she's classified and also for Reading Results
- Set Priorities
 - Link the Foundation prioritization to the CAP
 - Counselor has the most impact to all students and to the CAP
 - PE is an important fundraising message for families
 - For 3rd grade, the scope and sequence for technology prepares students for testing
 - EAs are important for the lower grades
 - Less than half-time for EAs. 2-3 for the cost of .5 FTE
 - Summary: EAs done differently & math specialist; maintain everything else
