Smithfield High School CTE Law and Public Safety Pathway

The Law and Public Safety Pathway at Smithfield High School serves as an introduction to the American legal system and criminal justice process as well as a physical and mental preparation to enter the field of first responders. Courses offered will excite your natural curiosity to solve problems and disputes. Students will learn how to answer some of the most pressing questions within the criminal justice system, such as: What makes a guilty mind? How can we reform the correction system? How do we ensure that all defendants receive a fair trial? You will learn how to apply the rules of the law to many situations which are prevalent in society. You will analyze ethics, criminal and civil law, the trial process, tort law, the law of contracts, product liability, warranties, and student rights. Mock trials enhance the course concepts and allow the students to argue cases in front of a jury while analyzing real and hypothetical criminal scenarios, evaluating all elements.
