Central Prays at All Five Campuses

Extended 10 days this year, Central's 24-7 Prayer Event moved to all five Central campuses and drew 780 members and friends to pray for at least an hour through passages taken from 1 Peter brought alive in interactive stations. This year again, the 24-7 Prayer event also reached many who were able to participate online.

Organized yearly by the Prayer Ministry at Central, led by Prayer Pastor Paul Covert and Associate Prayer Pastor, Cathy Cryer, this year the 24-7 team included more than 200 people. Those helping designed stations for the Prayer Room, served as hosts around the clock, provided security from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m., and helped people sign up to pray.

The Spirit was definitely moving as the team prayerfully considered how to convey verses from this year's theme based on 1 Peter. Together, they creatively designed and set up stations with scenery and props that had everything from winding roads depicted to lead to God, to a giant foam likeness of a hand to represent God's hand over us. Station after station reflected God's glory and 1st Peter came alive as each station reminded us to claim our inheritance, to love each other, to get rid of all malice and deceit, hypocrisy, envy and slander, to be ready to give an answer, to have humility toward one another, to cast all our cares upon Him, to serve others, to endure suffering, and to be living stones.

According to Cathy "the place was a buzz with Junior High kids…all going through the stations."

24/7 affected people in many different ways. Our hosts and security team were able to see firsthand how people were moved as they came out of the stations and witnessed some precious moments such as the lady in the wheelchair who was helped by some boys to move through the stations, and one man who was moved to tears so much that a host held his hand and said a prayer for him. Some hosts and security even took on more shifts to make sure all the slots were covered. What a dedicated team of servant ministers we have!
