Greek Glossary

Potential New Member (PNM): Anyone who is eligible to participate in recruitment.

Active: A member who has completed their period as a new member and who has been formally initiated into their organization.

Alumna: A sorority member who is no longer in college. Plural is alumnae.

Bid: A formal invitation to become a member of a sorority.

Chapter: A collegiate branch of a national or international sorority; the local organization.

Primary Recruitment: A process of membership selection a PNM goes through to join a sorority. This process occurs once a year in the Fall at UW.

Continuous Open Bidding: A less formal and more flexible process for joining a sorority. Occurs throughout the school year and a PNM can join at any point during the school year.

Greek: A term applied to members of fraternities and sororities.

Initiation: The formal ceremony through which new members are initiated into full membership within the sorority.

Invitation: A request for a potential new member to attend the next round of events from a sorority.

Legacy: A potential new member whose mother, sister, and/or grandmother is an alumna or active member of that specific national or international sorority.

National Panhellenic Conference (NPC): A collective body of twenty-six national and international fraternal organizations.

New Member: A member who has recently joined a sorority and has not yet been initiated into full membership.

Continuous Open Bidding

Continuous Open Bidding (COB) is a more informal style of Recruitment as compared to Primary Recruitment (PR). We have this alternative recruitment process so that if a student is interested in joining a sorority but was unable to/did not attend PR, just transferred into UW, or if they would prefer a more relaxed recruitment setting, they may still have a chance to become a member of our Panhellenic Community.

COB takes place throughout the year, starting after PR ends and goes until the end of spring quarter. Each chapter has their own unique, informal recruitment style, but most processes will consist of an informal meeting with one or two members to answer your questions about the chapter, where they will also get to know a little more about you. They may also invite PNMs to the chapter for dinner, a house tour, or sisterhood event, all of which give the potential new member the opportunity to gain experience with other members in the chapter. Throughout the informal recruitment process, a PNM may be extended an invitation to join one or multiple organizations. This invitation is called a "bid," and once signed, will indicate that a PNM is now a New Member of that chapter. The PNM will sign an MRABA after she is offered a "bid" and this is a binding agreement.

Bids can be extended at any point during the academic year. However, it is important to note that not all 18 chapters participate in this process, and receiving a bid is not guaranteed. Each chapter eligible has a different number of spots available. In addition, chapters may expect their New Members to move in at the earliest possible opportunity, and while this may vary, please keep this in mind and communicate your housing needs with each chapter that you meet with. This process is much less structured, and it will fall heavily on YOU to dictate your experience. You can learn about COB live in requirements [here](#).

COB Process

What does the process look like?

You can then reach out to chapters to schedule a “date”, wait for them to reach out, and/or attend COB events

You must respond to all chapters and they must respond to you but you do not have to meet with every single chapter that reaches out and vice versa

After this you can meet chapters or see what feels like a good fit!

What do COB dates look like?

COB Events

- Hosted by the chapter with more PNMs and chapter members present
- Usually centered around an activity
- Examples: Tote bag painting, friendship bracelet, snacks, speed dating, etc

One on One dates

- Normally meet 1-3 members from a chapter
- Examples: Coffee dates, facility tours, going for a walk, or just chatting

Next Steps

Chapters will reach out within 72 hours after your meeting

They will let you know if they want to continue meeting with you, you can also choose to not to continue meeting with them

Depending how many meetings you have had they can extend a bid to you which you can choose to accept or decline

COB General Rules To Know

Two Date Minimum

You must meet with a chapter a minimum of two times before they are allowed to extend you a bid. They can choose to meet with you more than twice but that is up to the chapters discretion.

Responding

You must respond to all chapters that reach out to you and they must respond to you. You do not have to meet with every chapter if you do not want to but you must respond to all COB emails/messages. If you have any problems with chapters not responding to you please reach out to Sarah Brown at phrecdev@uw.edu!

Bids

Once a chapter extends a bid to you then you have up to 48 hours to accept or decline the bid. Bids can expire if you do not respond within 48 hours so make sure to communicate with the chapter. You can ask for an extension from the chapter but it is not guaranteed. Once you sign an MRABA you cannot join another sorority at UW for the rest of the school year.

Substances

COB dates and meetings should be drug and alcohol-free environments. If you ever find yourself in a situation that makes you uncomfortable or if you are invited to fraternity property by a chapter during this process, please don't hesitate to inform Panhellenic. Your safety and well-being are our top priorities.

University of Washington College Panhellenic Continuous Open Bidding Potential New Member Code of Ethics and Agreement of Mutual Respect

“We, as Undergraduate Members, stand for good scholarship, for guarding of good health, for maintenance of fine standards, and for serving, to the best of our ability, our college community. Cooperation for furthering fraternity life, in harmony with its best possibilities, is the ideal that shall guide our fraternity activities. We stand for service through the development of character, inspired by the close contact and deep friendship of individual fraternity and Panhellenic life. The opportunity for wide and wise human service, through mutual respect and helpfulness, is the tenet by which we strive to live.”

This is accomplished by abiding by the following agreements:

- Respect for the Continuous Open Bidding process is expected at all times.
 - This includes respect toward chapter members, Panhellenic officers, university faculty and staff, and other potential new members.
- A potential new member (PNM) shall respond to all chapters that reach out within a reasonable time frame.
- A PNM shall give their full attention to chapter members during the date.
- PNMs shall not make any disparaging remarks about chapters or individuals.
 - This includes verbal or written communication, including social media posts.
- PNMs should refrain from sexist, homophobic, racist, or otherwise abhorrent conversations.
- **COB dates are a substance-free process and should not include men.** PNMs may not use or be in the presence of paraphernalia during the Continuous Open Bidding process.
 - Activities and conversation should not revolve around either of these topics.
 - Chapters may choose to avoid these questions but you can ask questions that are important to you.

Failure to abide by the expectations stated above will result in the review of your status as a potential new member. All Potential New Members must sign this Code of Ethics which will be included in the COB registration form.

PNM Bill of Rights

- ★ The right to be treated as an individual.
- ★ The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process.
- ★ The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from chapter members.
- ★ The right to be treated with respect.
- ★ The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized.
- ★ The right to ask how and why and receive straight answers.
- ★ The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others.
- ★ The right to be fully informed about binding agreements implicit in the acceptance card signing.
- ★ The right to make one's choice and decision and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision.
- ★ The right to have a positive, safe, and enriching recruitment and new member experience.
- ★ Any potential member who experiences something contrary to the above statements should contact the University of Washington Panhellenic Association and discuss the matter with the Vice President of Recruitment Development or the Panhellenic President.
- ★ Violating any of these rules could result in your removal from the COB process and impact your ability to join a chapter at UW

MRABA Explanation:

The MRABA is the binding agreement that you will complete when you accept a chapter's bid. Once you sign this agreement you cannot join another group on campus for the duration of the school year even if you drop the chapter before being initiated. The next time you could join a chapter after signing your MRABA is through primary recruitment 2025 or COB following primary recruitment 2025. This video explains what it means to sign an MRABA, some of the video may not pertain to COB but the general concept is correct.

Panhellenic Officers:

Sarah Brown, current Vice President of Recruitment Development for Panhellenic, is the one who runs COB and is happy to answer any questions you may have. If you want to meet with her during Autumn Quarter, feel free to stop by her office hours which will begin when school starts in HUB 236 or reach out to her phrecdev@uw.edu to schedule a time to meet.

Questions to Ask During COB:

Ice Breakers:

- ★ What is your favorite thing about UW?
- ★ What is your major?
- ★ What is one piece of advice you have for someone starting at UW?
- ★ Why did you decide to go Greek?
- ★ What is your favorite memory from your chapter?

Scholarship:

- ★ Is there a grade requirement I must meet?
- ★ If I am unable to meet the GPA, what actions are taken?
- ★ What type of scholarship program and/or scholarships does your sorority offer?
- ★ What kind of support does the chapter provide academically?
- ★ Are there members in the chapter with my major?
- ★ As a new member, will my scholarship requirements differ from an older sister's?

Sisterhood:

- ★ What sisterhood activities does the chapter plan?
- ★ Do the members spend time together outside of meetings and mandatory events?
- ★ What makes your chapter's sisterhood strong?
- ★ How well do you get to know everyone in the chapter?

Activities:

- ★ How active is your chapter in intramurals?
- ★ Are your members involved in academic groups on campus?
- ★ How involved is your sorority in other campus activities?
- ★ Do you participate in activities with other fraternities/sororities?

Service and Philanthropy:

- ★ What service opportunities are available through the chapter?
- ★ Is there a service hour requirement or expectation for members?
- ★ What philanthropies do you support?
- ★ Do you help support the philanthropies of other chapters?
- ★ What is your favorite philanthropy event you have attended or been a part of?

Costs and time:

- ★ What are the time commitments as a member of your sorority?
- ★ What are the financial commitments for a member of your sorority?

- ★ Are there any costs on top of regular dues?
- ★ Do you have payment plans available if needed?

Member education:

- ★ What is your new member education period like? What is its purpose?
- ★ What rules do you have for new members?
- ★ How long does it take before I am initiated?
- ★ What is the time commitment for new members?
- ★ What things does your chapter do to provide education to all members?

Comparison:

- ★ What are the advantages of membership in your sorority?
- ★ What made your chapter stand out to you during recruitment?
- ★ What is the thing you find most unique about your chapter?

Lifelong benefits:

- ★ What alumni connections are available through your organization?
- ★ Is there a local alumnae organization?
- ★ Are alumnae actively involved with your chapter and if so, how are they involved?

Housing:

- ★ What are the live requirements?
- ★ What areas are visitors allowed/not allowed in?
- ★ How are people selected or assigned to live in the chapter house?
- ★ How much space is available for each member's belongings?
- ★ What kinds of rooms does your chapter have?

Leadership:

- ★ What leadership opportunities are available in your sorority?
- ★ Do members have leadership positions outside of the sorority?
- ★ How do you encourage leadership in the workplace or on campus?
- ★ Are there positions I can hold as a new member?

Personal/experience:

- ★ Why did you choose this sorority?
- ★ How were you sure it was the right choice for you?
- ★ How has being a member of this sorority benefited you?
- ★ What would you have asked during recruitment if you could go back and do it again

Sam's Law and Anti-Hazing Efforts

Washington State's updated hazing law, also known as "Sam's Law," went into effect in 2022. The law was named after Sam Martinez, a first-year student from Washington State University (WSU) who died from alcohol poisoning while being a new member in 2019. The law includes requirements around hazing prevention and reduction at higher education institutions. The UW Panhellenic Executive Board stands firmly against hazing and is strongly in support of this law.

In accordance with our recognition agreement and Panhellenic Bylaws, each chapter is required to complete hazing programming each year in order to remain active and in good standing with the University. This programming educates our members on the types of hazing and its consequences and encourages them to take an active stand against it. Our Panhellenic community is committed to creating a hazing-free community.

In compliance with Sam's Law, fraternities and sororities at Washington universities must provide notice of the previous five years of all findings of violations of anti-hazing policies, state or federal laws relating to hazing, alcohol, drugs, sexual assault, or physical assault, or the institution's code of conduct against the local chapter on their websites. These violations can also be found on our Panhellenic website and individual chapter Instagram bios. If you are concerned with a chapter's violation status, we urge you to ask questions to the chapter directly during your rounds.
