Introduction

Welcome to TechGeekProd's typing lesson!

In this document, I assume you are using the Dvorak Simplified Keyboard Layout. It looks like this:

If your keyboard doesn't look like that, but more like this:

you're looking at the wrong page. If you're the stubborn kind and want to proceed with this, please go ahead and taste the agony. (And I'm not lying. It's just painful to learn typing the wrong way...)

Terms

Due to my geekiness, I would sometimes say some things you might not understand.

Abbreviation of fingers

This is what I call your fingers, since saying "left pointer finger" all the time is too time-consuming.

L: Left hand R: Right hand 1: thumb 2: pointer 3: middle 4: ring 5: pinky ^/v: extend up/down </>: extend inward/outward

Chapter 1

Lesson 1: U, H and Space

The first keys you will learn how to use are U and H.

Those ones. Note that, most of the time, those keys have a little bump on them.

Close your eyes and try to locate them using your pointer fingers.

Remember, U is L2 and H is R2.

To open space between the words, you press the Spacebar, the long key near the bottom of your keyboard. It is commonly abbreviated to Space. Space is L1 or R1. Until you get used to it, just use R1.

Here's practice. Type this as fast and accurate as you can. Take your time till you get used to it. uu hh hhuu huhu uh uuh uhhu huhh huu uuhh uhuh hh

Lesson 2: E, T, and Enter

The next keys you are going to learn are E and T.

E is L3, and T is R3. Enter is R5>>. (Extend your right pinky two keys to the right.)

With these four keys, you can already type some legit words.

What the enter key does is go to a new line. It is commonly shown as a bendy arrow: \checkmark . (For those

who can't display this arrow, it goes down and bends to the left at a right angle.)

Lesson 3: O and N

If you're observant enough, you might have noticed the pattern, but yes, these are L4 and R4.

Lesson 4: A and S

L5 and R5. Nuff said. By the way, those eight keys are commonly referred to as "home position", since your fingers rest there, or are at least supposed to be resting there.

Here we go!

Lesson 5: I and D

For these letters, you have to move your pointers inward. I is typed with L2> and D is typed with R2<.

Lesson 7: P and G

Now, if you have average intelligence, you probably have noticed that the keyboard has more than one row.

Let's move on to the top row.

Lesson 10: Comma (,) and R

' is L5^ and L is R5^. They are above A and S. Reminder: Make sure you're pressing the keys with the right fingers!

Lesson 11: Y and F

Time for some diagonal movement. Y is L2^>, F is R2^<.

Lesson 12: Shift and Hyphen

To type uppercase letters, use the Shift keys. There are one on each side, and it's good practice to use the right Shift key with letters that are typed with your left hand, and to use the left Shift key with letters that are typed with your right.

All keys are typed with the pinky finger.

Alternate between the Shift keys while entering these words:

You're Never Entering Real Answers Say Pastry Flying Over

Shift + apostrophe = double quote.

Oscar Says "You're Near Ecuador, So Pull Trays Up, Dudes"

Some practice sentences with the hyphen.

Real go-getters can feel a strong Spidey-Sense of duty and urgency.

Oh la-ti-da, you're hopeless at locating the flying-cane ahead of this fully-refined Platonic ideal of an all-school fashionista.

Lesson 13: Exclamation point (!) and Question mark (?)

Exclamation points and question marks require the Shift key.

Exclamation point is Shift + 1, and 1 is L5^{$^$}.

Question mark is Shift+Slash, and Slash is R5^>.
