Program Description

The Associate in Transportation Management program with a Specialization in Faith-Based Urban Mobility and Access equips students with the knowledge to manage transportation systems and services while addressing issues of access and equity through a faith-based lens. This program combines practical training in logistics and urban planning with Christian principles of stewardship, service, and justice.

Students will study public transportation systems, sustainable mobility solutions, logistics coordination, and transportation planning. The faith-based focus encourages the development of inclusive, ethical strategies to enhance transportation access for underserved communities, empowering students to advocate for mobility as a form of ministry and outreach.

Graduates may work in transit management, nonprofit mobility programs, church transportation services, or pursue a bachelor's degree in urban planning, public administration, or logistics.

Capstone Project (3 Credit Hours)

The Capstone in Faith-Based Urban Mobility and Access challenges students to propose a transportation improvement plan grounded in faith values. Projects may include:

- Developing a church shuttle system for underserved neighborhoods.
- Creating a mobile outreach plan for a local ministry.
- Proposing a city partnership to improve transit access for low-income families.

Program Outcomes

Graduates of this program will:

- Understand systems and policies in transportation management.
- Apply biblical principles to enhance equity and mobility.
- Design accessible transit strategies for faith and community use.
- Collaborate on urban planning projects with a servant-leader mindset.
- Pursue careers or further education in transportation, ministry, or public policy.
