

Kenosha Unified Athletics – Hall of Fame Inductee – Class of 2016

Kellie Schneider – 2006

Kellie Schneider was a standout athlete for Tremper High School's track and cross country teams, earning a varsity letter all four years of her high school career. She was named Outstanding First-Year Runner during her freshman season and went on to lead the cross country team as a captain during her junior and senior years. Schneider also was named most valuable athlete during her sophomore, junior and senior years and first team all-conference, all-state and all-county all four years. She placed in the top 8 at state meets each year and took first at the county meet each year. Schneider holds Tremper's record for the fastest time in a state meet (14:27) and the conference record for a 4K (14:17).

For track and field, Schneider earned first-place four times at regional meets, twice at sectional meets and once at a state meet throughout her high school career. She also earned second place at three sectional meets. Additionally, Schneider holds the Tremper record for the 1600-meter (5:01.61).

Schneider started cross country at Tremper with little knowledge of what she was getting into. As a shy freshman, she matured into a confident athlete and leader who was not to be denied her goals. Additionally, her family's support gave her the basis for the positive attitude she always demonstrated. As an athlete, Schneider was well respected by her teammates, not only as the frontrunner, but also as a role model of what it took to be a winner. Her work ethic and commitment as an athlete was one of Tremper's finest.

Schneider earned a four-year University of Kansas track and field scholarship from 2006-2010.
