

Kingsbury Family Foundation Scholarships

Congratulations on deciding to apply for a Kingsbury Family Foundation scholarship. The scholarships are made possible because of gift from Harley R. Kingsbury, a life long resident of Walsh County.

These \$1,000 scholarships are awarded to Walsh County residents who graduate from an area high school that is at least partially in Walsh County. Any resident of the St. Thomas, ND is also eligible to apply. Residency is based upon where the student returns to "in time of repose" at the time of graduation. That may be the home of the parents, grandparents, or other family members. It may also include students living with non-family members as agreed to by the student's legal guardian.

The Kingsbury Family Foundation will be the final determinate in awarding the scholarships. We hope to announce the awardees at any honors convocation your school holds before, or at your high school graduation ceremony. The award is payable upon proof of your enrollment in the first term of your post-graduate education which must be not later than February 15th of the year following your high school graduation. This date may be deferred to a later time upon your application to, and approval by, the Kingsbury Family Foundation for a delayed entry.

Scholarship Criteria

The scholarship criteria are:

- 1). A grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4 point system
- 2). Extra curricular activities in at least 3 clubs or sports, or community activities.
- 3). A letter of reference from a professional high school staff or teacher, or minister or business person or recognized community leader.
- 4). A list that includes the applicants career objectives. Also, a list of the applicants future goals. The applicant may also include an essay not to exceed 500 words about the importance of a post secondary education to the applicant.
- 5). High School transcript signed by principal, counselor, or appropriate school official,

Harley Kingsbury believed that technical or trade people make significant economic and social contributions to our society. It was his wish that people pursuing a post secondary degree requiring less than a four year education be considered for these scholarships as well as those pursuing a four year degree.

Therefore, the Kingsbury Family Foundation encourages applications from those pursuing a four year degree, and also those pursuing a degree requiring less than four years of school.

Students receiving a Kingsbury Family Foundation Scholarship must begin their education no later than February 15th following the year the scholarship is awarded. Exceptions for time of enrollment may be made upon the proper request, and with the approval of The Kingsbury Family Foundation.
