What is Hospice?

Hospice is a philosophy of care that supports patients and their families during the final stages of a life-limiting illness. The InHouse commitment emphasizes comfort, quality care and compassion one patient and family at a time, in familiar surroundings.

<u>Training (Hospice 101)</u>

Four hours: on-line modules. Eight hours: in-person.

Topics: Communication, Death and Dying, Grief and Loss, Bereavement, Spirituality,

Understanding Dementia,

Cultural and religious norms.

In addition to the patient visitor role, training will cover many important aspects of Hospice including history, philosophy, the care team, plan of care, family support, scope of practice, and Government/Medicare oversight.

Our patients reside in assisted living, nursing homes, memory care facilities, or private homes. There are varying levels of disease progression and/or cognitive impairment including dementia.

The Volunteer Role

As a hospice volunteer, you are a valuable member of the hospice care team that includes Physician, RN, Aide, Social Work, Chaplain,

Add to someone's quality of life by lending a helping hand to provide conversation, companionship, reading, legacy projects, basic errands, craft activities, respite for families, and more.

After training, you will be assigned a patient(s). The Volunteer Coordinator will provide the patient's background information and will accompany you on the first introduction visit. You will always have the option to decline a particular patient.

Once you have been assigned, future visits will be scheduled based on patient need and your availability. Visits last about 30 minutes to one hour and can be scheduled anywhere from once a month to weekly. You will also have opportunities to accompany our Social Worker, Chaplain, or Music Therapist.

You can also volunteer in the office by helping with data entry, filing, binder and folder preparation and other miscellaneous tasks.

Mandated by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid:

- Mandatory training of approximately twelve hours; four online and eight in-person
- All volunteers are required to have two-step annual tuberculosis (TB) testing to meet compliance requirements.
- The State of Michigan requires criminal background checks and fingerprinting for all hospice volunteers.
- Valid driver's license and insurance
