



Orangeland is Founded in Partnership with Major Former Healthcare Giant

The former health insurance giant Orange Cross and Green Shield, of Orangeland in rural Greater Appalachia, completed a task they set out for many years ago. The insurance giant spent tens of millions of dollars in a multi-year battle lobbying the citizens of rural Greater Appalachia to form a municipality in their own separate town. The municipality of Orangeland has been founded with a population of approximately 2,500 people in the precinct of Greater Virginia. Additionally, Orangeland voted in favor of pushing for a municipality-wide health

insurance program run by the town, in compliance with the Greater Appalachia Healthcare Services Act. It is currently illegal for any private entity to offer health insurance or healthcare coverage, but the services are offered through the municipality which is compliant with all appropriate rules and regulations.

Orangeland pledges to not only offer its citizens additional healthcare services and coverage, but the entire state's services as well. They are pledging to rapidly expand the town's capabilities statewide to serve the entire state. Greater Appalachia's state healthcare service is grossly underfunded, only covering $\frac{1}{4}$ of its expected costs to provide adequate care. Unfortunately, it is illegal for nearly all private healthcare coverage, so only the rich can leave to other states or other countries regularly to provide care. In an ironic twist of fate, the “Greater Appalachian Health Services Act,” known as Googcare, is harming the people it is supposed to help. The Governor probably doesn’t care though because he can still brag that universal coverage exists in the state. He probably pats himself on the back in meetings with other Governors on how great he is for providing healthcare for the “poor people” and that they owe him and the party votes in upcoming elections. I bet that he and his rich friends can go to other states or countries if they need quality care. The few private healthcare services in Greater Appalachia that may exist must be paid for “out of pocket”.

The most recent budget didn't appropriate any funding for Googcare and the funding that the bill provides (through a payroll tax that is separate from the income tax) provides only a fraction of the funds needed to provide adequate coverage to all Appalachians. Did the Dems plan this or did they really screw this up badly? If that isn't bad enough, there are harsh financial penalties for any company that tries to fill in the gap, as if most people could afford it with the crazy high taxes Greater Appalachia has.

I suspect that many people would ask how this newly founded town could offer such services to such a wide variety of people. Orangeland will be contracting out nearly all the services to "Orange Cross and Green Shield" which will be providing them as a contractor working for the municipality to provide both coverage and insurance capabilities working for the town. They will be receiving compensation for services rendered to Orangetopia and will be using its remaining infrastructure in a public partnership to jumpstart healthcare services for the American people in Greater Appalachia. I hope the Republican Party and some sane Democrats can get their act together so that the average Joe has access to the healthcare we need.
