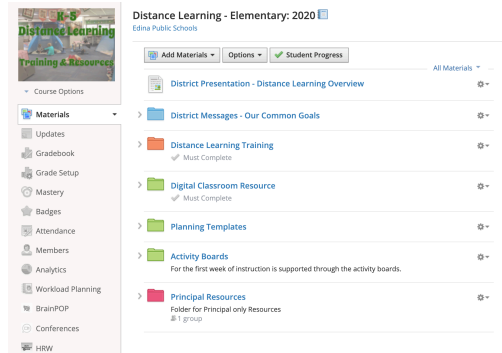

Online Learning Myths

Looks like a lot of these are starting to rear their ugly heads again. If you have families, or have other teachers question the validity of online learning, keep these in mind. If you can think of any more, please share them in the forum.

Myth: Online courses are easier

Truth: Most online courses are equally, if not more, rigorous.

- Aligned to state standards;
- Require active participation;
- Supervised by licensed teachers;
- Have attendance policies;
- Have competency-based academic progress requirements;
- Challenging to pass.
- All students are responsible for demonstrating mastery of all material, as in a face-to-face course students may be able to sit out of some discussions and listen as a passive participant.

Myth: Online learning will save money because teachers can handle more students in less time

Truth: Online courses are often reported as requiring the same type of investments in time and money

Teachers report:

- working just as hard as they now have more individual work to grade as assigned to group discussions and projects. All students are responsible for all learning;
- spending more time with individual students and putting in the effort to find new ways to build those relationships;
- configuring content in new ways as it is not simply moving course materials into an online format;
- employing new teaching strategies and curriculum.

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- At Northern Star Online we have determined that teachers should not be assigned any more of a student load than they would in a face-to-face classroom. These are not independent study courses, they require facilitation, and feedback, as well as opportunities for a social component.
 - Just as in any program, money can be saved on subscriptions by moving to OER for content, but that money is used in development; hosting; management; re-design.

Myth: Students can cheat more easily online

Truth: Cheating is not more prevalent online than in the classroom (in fact, it may be less).

- Technological ways of determining and tracking plagiarism and access;
- Teachers get to know student idiosyncrasies, skills, writing styles, sometimes faster than they might in the classroom;
- Student writing has a voice, making it easier to spot inconsistencies in submitted work;
- Assignments designed for higher order thinking skills make answers harder to google;
- Students can be asked to record themselves via audio/video directly into their submissions.

On Quizzing

Here are some quick and easy things:

- Make the quizzes required to move on to the next content but do not have the scores factor into the gradebook;

- Create a question bank that pulls a smaller number of random questions;
- Randomize responses and questions;
- Add a time limit (be prepared to create roles or versions to that ignore any time limits to meet IEP/504 requirements);
- Work on wording questions that make it harder to google responses;
- Use images and descriptions and have students identify the components you are looking for (keep accessibility in mind with sufficient descriptions in alt text).

Myth: Online students have little social interaction

Truth: Online students have equal (if not better, but certainly different) opportunities for positive social interaction.

- Online students report less bullying and reduced negative interactions;
- Schedule outings with other students;
- Expectations for community involvement;
- Wider range and diversity of students involved in taking the same courses.

One of the first professional development modules we offer has to do with creating Teacher, Social, and Cognitive Presence in courses. The social component of a course is just as important as the other two, as all three are dependent upon each other.

There is an example of a student with anxiety who could not attend school any longer due. She only needed one more credit to graduate and in that course she was required to keep a blog, and find other blogs to comment on. She wrote about a book that was helping her through some of her issues and the author of that book found the student's blog and reached out to her. They had a conversation that was incredibly moving for that student. So much so, that by the end of the semester she was working at a coffee shop as a barista, and had enrolled for the following semester at a local community college.

We have also had reports of students being able to connect with peers while:

- Taking care of ailing relatives in Nigeria;
- Connecting from Florida with the class as she was forced to leave due to family circumstances;
- Students connecting with others and academic work who are living on their own, or working full time

The list goes on. While we can recognize that online learning may not be everyone's first choice, it is an option that has afforded opportunities for students in all walks of life

from around the state. We should also recognize that the traditional system has left many students behind and does not work so well for them. With online learning, we can use the data of student interactions, completion, time on task, grades, and more to make targeted improvements that support all learners. Online courses are often more accessible and provide a greater range of accommodations for learners on IEP/504 plans. These changes result in better and faster outcomes for all learners.
