**A review of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization with House Speaker
Scribba25.**

Al E. Gator: *"It's a fascinating development that we will definitely have to follow up on. Anyway, for the reason you're here: NATO! This first question*

is odd, but given how Former president trump was a vocal dissenter of the Alliance, what are your thoughts?"

Scribba25: "As we near the end of 2022, the alliance has increased by eighteen member states from the original twelve in 1949, bringing the grand total to thirty nations dedicated to the safety and security of the North Atlantic Region. NATO is as important now as during its founding, especially with the resurgence of the Russian bear."

Al E. Gator: "Could you point to some examples of this resurgence?"

Scribba25: "Sure. Russia regularly violates and probes the airspaces of nations like [Sweden](#) and Finland to test response times. Russia. Russia has even violated American [airspace](#) at times. And of course, you know about Russia's troop build up on the Ukrainian border."

Al E. Gator: "Has there been significant updates on the latter?"

Out of thirty, that may seem huge, but you must keep in mind that these other nations have a deep care for their citizens. The choice presented between them is more military funding, or cutting back on essential healthcare services. In addition, there is a cost sharing plan based on National income. The annual spending for NATO is three Billion dollars. The United States provides around [sixteen percent](#) of that, alongside Germany."*

Al E. Gator: *"In layman's terms?"*

Scribba25: *"The United States pays a proportionate amount of money to the alliance based on income. We are a large, wealthy nation and we pay our fair share."*
