

# White House Wedding: A Look At What The Warring Political Parties Want And How They Think

The author would also like to offer a non-apology now. The author has received the opinions of 500 different Americans and the author needs to express her opinion. It will help explain some things. Also, the bibliography was made first and the author felt it was too long to expand with extra sources.

## 2. Introduction and Background

### a. Introduction

I would like to start with the purpose of this study. I would like to continue with the introduction of the person who wrote this study for some context and to see where I am coming through. I will also be including visuals and more purposes.

#### i. Purpose Of The Study:

## b. Background

### i. Personal Background And Rant

Now, let me introduce you to me, the author of this paper. I am a cis heteronormative, white, neurodivergent female. My pronouns are she/her. I am 30 years old at the time of writing this, however, people who look at me tend to be shocked that I am not 16. Like I said, I am not a political expert. I write and I draw as hobbies.

As for my politics, I am also what I call a political atheist and a preferred nonvoter. I have only voted once in my life. I know I just lowered a ton of people reading this' hearts. The next couple paragraphs will be an analogy for why I don't. But, here's what I mean by a political atheist. Liberals or Democrats believe that the modern day is terrible and that we can make rules to make things better for everyone in the future. Conservatives or Republicans believe the modern day is terrible and that things were better decades or centuries ago. I believe the modern day is terrible, but there's not really anything you can do because while a law might work for one person, it won't work for another person.

As you can tell, there is a false optimism that goes into believing either side. I have no faith in humanity. Part of voting or being political involves faith in humanity, even if it's only certain types of people. So, first, as you can tell, I am too pessimistic to vote. It's not that I see no light at the end of the tunnel; it's just that I know that the light is coming from a train and I have to run to not get run over. For a better explanation for why I don't vote and why I did once, I would like you to visualize this:

SCP-096 is what appears to be a giant skeletal white male presenting a humanoid thing (I mean white skin, it's not caucasian like me) with unnaturally long arms. It has the intelligence of a one-year-old, and usually spends its days pacing the box it's in. However, it will murder anyone who sees its face, even if you couldn't make it out. The times I have voted, I remember that was the first time in my life where I had an honest-to-god panic attack. After I did the deed, I was awake, but, I went through that thing you go through after you take a test like the SAT/ACTs or GEDs where you're awake, but, in a way it feels like your brain is missing. I felt dead after I did it. So, I don't want to do it again.

### 3. Survey and Hypothesis

#### 3.1. Survey Design

For this, there are two main questions. One will be phrased as the scenario that was given to those who took the survey. The other will be phrased more scientifically. Next, I will also mention some details left out of the survey as they don't matter. Finally, I will bring up the hypothesis for this report.

Here's the scenario proposed in the survey run: America elects a younger president who isn't married, but has been in a serious, long-term, committed relationship with a woman or female identifying person for several years. The Valentines' Day after Inauguration, the president finally asks her to marry them and she says yes. If you were her, what would the bridal gown and bridesmaids' dresses look like?

Now, here's some details I didn't include because it didn't matter. I didn't tell them that the president is 35-years-old and the first lady is 29-years-old. I didn't tell them the First Lady is a country singer. I didn't tell them that the first lady's skin tone is called "Medium Deep Golden" by Crayola's Colors Of The World. I didn't tell them that the first lady never got over the death of her father, and some of her vision was inspired by his affectionate nickname for her. I didn't mention that she and the president have been a couple for seven years, and living together for four. I didn't mention that she is trying to pay homage to her husband's authority over the US military by finding a dress that compliments it. I also didn't mention she is going to be fifteen weeks pregnant at the time of the wedding.

Here are the options listed for the survey:

The main question for this whole survey was what the wedding dresses would look like. The silhouette was asked about for the bride's dress. The neckline was asked about for the bride's dress. The color for the bride's dress was asked about despite the author suspecting white would be chosen because of what America thinks about it. The fabric for the bride's dress was asked about. For the bridesmaids' dresses, the color and fabric were asked about. (When color was asked for, it was advised for cisgendered men to ask for assistance if they needed help to know what the colors were due to men being proven to not be able to see as many colors as women.)

The options for the silhouette for the bride's dress were: A-Line, Trumpet, Column, Tea Length, Mermaid, Ballgown, Slip, Sheath, Mini, Empire, Fit And Flare, High-Low, Jumpsuit, Midi, Pantsuit, Skirt Suit, Romper, Separates, Princess, Bateau, and I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care.

The options for the neckline for the bride's dress were: Sweetheart/Semi-Sweetheart, Straight, V-Neck, Plunging, Illusion, High Neckline, Bateau/Boat Neck/Sabrina, One Shoulder, Off The Shoulder, Scoop, Halter, Jewel, Portrait, Empire/Square, Queen Anne, High, Halter Strap, Cowl, Surplice, Keyhole, Grecian, Décolleté, Asymmetrical, Sheer, Spaghetti Straps, Depends On Silhouette, and I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care.

The options for the color for the bride's dress were: Pure white, Off-White, Natural/Milk White, Ivory, Cream, Champagne, Nude, Mocha, Peach, Blush, Pink, Powder, Tan, Gold, Mink/Dusty Rose, Blue, Gray, Silver, Mint Green, Rose Gold, Red, Orange, Rainbow, Teal, Red, White And Blue, Depends On Silhouette And Neckline, and I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care.

The options for the fabric for the bride's dress were: Batiste, Brocade, Charmeuse, Chiffon, Crepe, Damask, Dotted Swiss, Dupioni, Faille, Gazar, Georgette, Lace, Mikado, Moire, Organza, Pique, Point D'Esprit, Polyester, Rayon, Satin, Shantung, Silk, Taffeta, Tulle, Velvet, Depends On Silhouette, Neckline, And Color, and I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care.

The options for the color for the bridesmaids' dresses were: Marsala Red (Similar To Burgundy), Silver, Amethyst, Dusty Rose, Navy Blue, Light Gray, Plum, Emerald Green, Turquoise, Bordeaux (Similar To Maroon), Nude, Cream, Blush Pink, Dusky Blue, Gold, Mint, Coral, Bright Purple, Dark Blue, White, Black, Sand, Peach, Orange, Red, Depends On Bride's Dress, and I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care.

The options for the fabric for the bridesmaids' dresses were: Chiffon, Georgette, Voile, Cady, Satin, Charmeuse, Peau De Soie, Mikado, Dupioni, Taffeta, Faille, Shantung, Jersey, Tulle, Mesh, Crepe Back Satin, Sequin, Velvet, Lace, Linen, Eyelet, Cotton Poplin, Guipure Lace, Nylon/Rayon Jersey, Brocade, Depends On Color, and I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care.

The amount of people needed for the survey was originally decided as 100 due to the show "Family Feud" surveying 100 assumingly US citizens out of 218 assumingly US citizens in 1976. However, after recalculating the US population for the 2020s because of the obvious population increase, the amount needed for the survey was increased to 500.

The overall question for the entire survey is: What are the effects of a person's age, gender identity, and political views on what dress they would recommend for the First Lady and her bridesmaids if the president gets married and has a White House wedding?

### 3.2. Hypothesis

It says a lot about how the two reigning parties think. For the first example, it has been revealed that Republican president Donald Trump's favorite music video is Guns N' Roses "November Rain". Oddly, around the same time, the movie Addams Family Values came out. In both the movie and the music video, the bride wore a white (in the movie's case ivory) off-the-shoulder satin high-low dress. If the dress described and shown below were what the conservatives/Republicans said, that would say a lot about the Republican/Conservative party. To the author, this would state that the Republican/Conservative party has sacrificed individuality and liberty to gain the approval and security of a 34 time convicted criminal.





For another example, the show “The Big Bang Theory” has both a female scientist and LGBTQ cast members. For the episode when her character got married, Mayim Bialik wore a white tulle and lace ballgown with a jewel neckline. If the dress described shown above were what was chosen the most by democrats/liberals, that says a lot about the democratic party/liberals. To the author, it says that the democrats/liberals are liars when they support body positivity and abolishing school dress codes and that they are going into supporting some conservative faiths while trying way too hard to capitulate to the LGBTQ+ community.

\*Only one more image will be a photograph or AI generated. While the author used references, she has drawn the rest of the images used in this essay to report survey results by hand, but, more on this later.

The author’s hypothesis was this: Cis women older than 55 and cis men who identify as center right wing/just right wing will choose a classic or traditional style for the brides’ dress, such as a Satin or Lace ball gown or an A-Line in white or ivory with a more conservative neckline, such as a Bateau or High Neck because these were the people ruining young girls’ permanent records for wearing shorts or tank tops. Younger cis women, center left cis men and cis women, just left cis men and cis women, those who identify as trans/nonbinary or another gender, and most who identify as moderate/apolitical will not know the bride and her wishes well enough to really care what the president’s wife wears to her wedding because they tend not to think people should get married as it supports the patriarchy. Far left identifying people will prefer a skirt suit because of women like Hillary Clinton, Nancy Pelosi, and several female politicians almost NEVER

wearing dresses despite the fact that Eva Braun wore a skirt suit to her wedding to Hitler. Far right identifying people will prefer a dress suit for exactly that reason. The results will be slightly all over the place for the fabric for the bride's dress fabric, the bridesmaid's dress colors and fabrics because different fabrics cause different shapes, but, they will meet somewhere with the bride dress silhouette, neckline and color.

## 4. Demographic Questions

### 4.1. A Quick Note On Race And Sexual Orientation

As you can see, the survey takers were not asked about race or sexual orientation. The reason for this is that it's complicated. One can point to Caitlyn Jenner being Republican despite being transgender and one has evidence of members of the LGBTQ party voting Republican despite that party sort of not respecting them. As for race, many African Americans vote Republican not because they support gun rights, banning abortion, and are anti-LGBTQ rights. Rather, they vote that way because the Republicans used to be the liberal party and were responsible for slavery being abolished in the US. So, as one can tell, it's complicated. So, race and sexual orientation was not asked for.

### 4.2. Demographic Questions

For the survey, the participants were asked for three different things about themselves. The first thing that was asked for was the age of the participants. The second thing that was asked for was the gender identity of the participants. The third and final thing that was asked for was the political identity of the participants. For ease of understanding, we will see the options for the political identity in their own divided sections in this report. The age categories are under 18, 18-24, 25-34, 35-44, 45-54, 55-64, 65 and over and prefer not to say. The gender identity categories are cis female, trans female, cis male, trans male, other, nonbinary and prefer not to say.

## 5. Results

### 5.1. Results

After recalculating the US population for the 2020s because of the obvious population increase, the amount needed for the survey was increased to 500. It was assumed the survey would only take about two weeks to be full, if filled at all. Instead, it took six months. It was conducted between December 2021 and ended in May 2022. Not for lack of trying; some people who were not US citizens tried to take the survey.

As the amount of time and people suggests, it was not easy to get the amount of people needed at all. There were three surveys using softwares used to get these results. The softwares were SurveyMonkey, SurveyPlanet, and Zoho. 376 of the takers were from SurveyPlanet and Zoho. The other 126 came from SurveyMonkey. However, social media also relied too much to find

takers. Reddit, Facebook, and Twitter were used. In fact, the author of this survey had her second Twitter account suspended for “spam” and had to make a third account due to this survey. Despite this, anyone who added the taker numbers up will see that two more were gathered than were actually needed.

Inventory was also taken in spreadsheets in Numbers (the Excel equivalent on a Mac). The author got overwhelmed by all the numbers and political identities (some people got their sexual orientation confused with their political identity; one person wrote “Vulcan”, there was a lot of hostile results that I must apologize to my loved one that they had to read), so, she had to ask a relative that works in Finance to assist in cleaning up the results and take notes on how people react to the scenario is put in SurveyMonkey (This software would not allow the scenario be referred to as a scenario, but, rather as a question. This kind of also brought in some much needed insight.). The results were only gathered after that was gathered. The author was confused about the results for one of the parties involved. Thankfully, she was able to correct this shortly before drawing the results. These results were also color coded by the author for the author’s convenience.

It was a success as you could see from gathering the results. Some people did not make this easy. One person skipped the bridesmaid’s dress color fabric. One person gave three political identities. One gave their age, gender, political identity, and votes for the brides’ dress, but not the bridesmaids’ dress. Two people gave two political identities. Three people gave only their age/gender/political parties but did not vote on the brides dress options. And, three people gave two different political identities.

The SurveyMonkey technology told the author that the majority of those taking the survey were female, 45-60 years old, in the Pacific region of the United States (Think California, Hawaii, Washington, Oregon, and Alaska), and make between \$25,000-\$49,999. However, the author has counted and the majority of the total people that took the survey were cis females that were at the youngest 18 years old, the oldest 44. The results will be in a chart later in this report, however.

When the states of origin could be determined, the five states that had the most takers from there are California (102), New York (26), Texas (13), Washington (12), and Georgia (11). Pennsylvania, North Carolina and Maryland tied with eight survey takers each. Oregon, Florida, and Illinois tied with seven survey takers each. Colorado had six survey takers. Arizona, Virginia, and Ohio tied with five survey takers each. South Carolina and Connecticut tied with four survey takers each. Minnesota, Hawaii, and Michigan tied with three survey takers. Maine, Indiana, Wisconsin, Kentucky, Tennessee, Washington DC, New Jersey, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Utah tied with two survey takers each. Nevada, Idaho, Montana, Kansas, Alabama, and Delaware tied with one state. Alaska, Arkansas, Mississippi, West Virginia, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont, Wyoming, New Mexico, South and North Dakota, Nebraska, Missouri, and Iowa did not have any survey takers. However, the author is chalking some of this up to the fact that some of these states are known to have a **VERY** high poverty and low access to a computer or the internet in general rate, so, she is assuming it’s that and not that no one in those states care for some of those.

Also, the author thought that the further left and right she went, the more anally conservative people would get. She thought the same thing about the older members that were taking the survey. However, she forgot that formal/wedding dresses can be altered to be more conservative, that the necklines people think can be “slutty” or “provocative” (attempting to cover every base here) have conservative cuts (especially V-Neck and Sweetheart; in fact, even Mormons have figured this out). I also realize some of the more conservative and the elderly were hoping the president chose a young thing and are choosing these as a prize for the groom to say “Good for you for getting elected so young and married, Mr. President. Here’s a pretty young thing as a prize.”

With some exceptions, here is how the results will be read out over the pages:

## 5.2. Explanation

There will be a paragraph or two for the party. In the paragraph or two, there will be an explanation of what the author qualified for that category. The author will also include any anecdotes about finding this category. If there are more than one paragraph, it will be the past two sentences. Then, there will be an image like the political cartoon below.

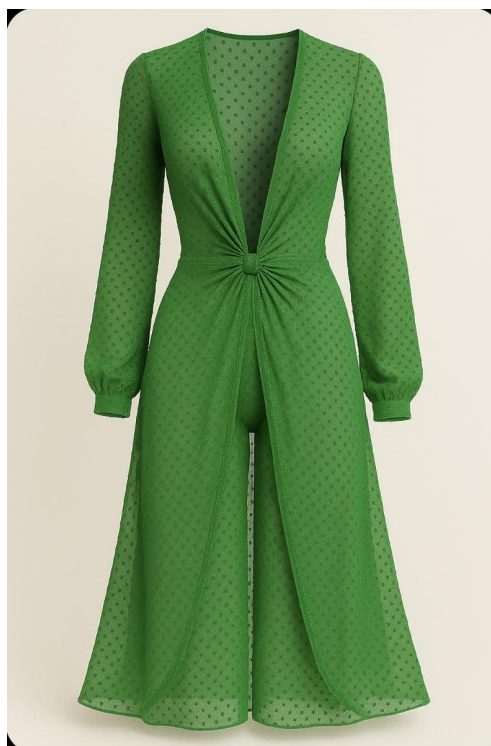


I will then provide some more context for what the picture is. Because the above image is just a placeholder for an example, I am not providing an explanation for this one.

### 5.3. A Trans Woman, A NeoNazi, And An Old Man: How Cleavage Might Save The Nation

One might be wondering if this is even possible to unite a wholly broken nation with a human interest thought experiment survey. To that, one must consider the real life situation that was encountered during the survey:

One of the male survey takers put USA in the category of political identity. The author has no knowledge of this person's knowledge of the fourteen words or how this person would react to discovering their son in a polyamorous gay mixed-race relationship or doing things that do not subscribe to society's anal retentive gender roles. However, if you answer the question "What is your political identity?" with "USA" post January 6, 2021, the author is highly suspect of them. Another person who ended up taking the survey near the first mention identified as a trans woman. From the limited knowledge the author has about trans women, they tend to be proud of their bodies and believe that a woman should be allowed to show it off on her big day, however, notice the author said "limited". Finally, around the same time, a man that many would consider elderly took the survey. This old man identified as independent, so, the author has no real idea how to judge them, but, not judging.



They all wanted to see the bride in a white dotted Swiss column silhouette with a plunging neckline. Imagine the upper dress in white.

However, this was the exact thing that the author of the survey was hoping to accomplish. The fact that three **VERY** different people all chose options that say "I hope the president's new wife has a liberal old school style and a HUGE rack" suggests that the Democrats and Republicans

can agree on something proves first that will be the only way to save this country. We will see what this proves as we go on.

## 5.4. I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care

Perhaps the most popular option used by every party was "I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care". Out of these options, it was chosen the most by Americans overall. The political party that chose this the most was those who identify as politically independent. That is why there will be no bridal dress choices or bridesmaids choices from those who identify as politically independent\*. However, this was also a large percentage with the other political parties. 184 out of 504 American citizens that took the survey don't know the bride well enough to care which bridal silhouette is chosen. 148 out of 504 Americans don't know her well enough to care about the bridal neckline. 99 out of 504 Americans don't know her well enough to care about the bridal color. 134 out of 504 Americans don't know her well enough to care about the bridal fabric. 126 out of 504 Americans don't know her well enough to care about the bridesmaids' dress' colors. Finally, 145 out of Americans don't know her well enough to care about the bridesmaids' dress' colors.

\*Independents tend to want to see a ball gown however.

You may be wondering what was meant by "I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care". As this the author will admit to some bias as this would be what she would have chosen. The author chose this for a couple reasons she will get to in a moment, but there are reasons that some of the other people chose this. Some might be disillusioned with the president and feel like he bullied his way into planning this. Some people are disillusioned with the concept of marriage and weddings as a whole. Some people are seriously over the wedding industry. And, some are worried about what the world will think about us for electing a bachelor.

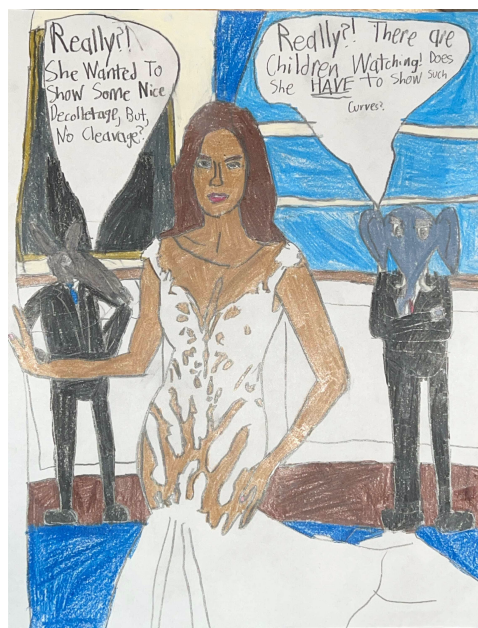
Now, here are the author's reasons for selecting "I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care" and this might have motivated the survey takers too. When it was put in, it was put in because it sings the chorus of cancelled rapper TI's "Whatever You Like" to describe how one feels about the bride's choices. By this, the wedding at the White House could be the bride getting married naked or have a Coca-Cola themed wedding for all you care if this was chosen. Someone who chooses this knows that someone will judge you no matter what for your choices for your wedding and funeral or other such events. Even if other countries judge her and the president for their choices, even the ayatollah of Iran and the pope know the worst they can do is silently judge them. Beyond that, the most beautiful people on their wedding day cannot even compare to the White House or Notre Dame or The Taj Mahal or any older building no matter what.

## 5.5. The Dress No One Wants To See

For this, one might expect that this section are the options that no one voted for. One would think this is the option that got absolutely zero votes. However, while this would be expected, it would be too complicated. All of the bridal silhouettes gowns got votes; the two that got closest to zero

were that only one person each voted for the bride wearing a mini dress or a midi dress. Zero people voted to see the president marry someone in a décolleté neckline dress, a cowl neckline, or a halter strap neckline. Zero people want to see her in a mink/dusty rose or a red dress (Which the author would point out, is strange as five people voted for a pink dress, three people each voted for rose gold dresses, blush dresses, and powder dresses, nine people voted for the red, white, and blue dresses, and one person voted to see a rainbow dress!). Zero people voted for the point d'esprit dress. Only one person wanted to see the bridesmaids wear an orange shantung dress.

Rather, here is the dress that has qualities that both Democrats/Liberals and Republicans/Conservatives hate\*:



Republicans are okay if the bride wears an illusion neckline, grecian neckline, or keyhole neckline. However, that being said, what Republican/Conservatives would be horrified and it would look like a regular Tuesday on Fox News/Newsmax is if the president's new bride stepped out in a form fitting silhouette. Mind you; neither side was crazy about a plunging neckline either, but, more Democrats/Liberals were okay with a form fitting silhouette like a mermaid, fit-and-flair or a trumpet. The author suspects the right would consider these forms too revealing and "slutty", (no way to be politically correct with some who vote this particular way unfortunately), and are going through their whole "think about the children" lie that they tell to get their way all the time.

The author suspects that the reason for this might be that most who identify as Republican/Conservatives are cis hetero white men. They see this and notice the bride's butt and hips. They see this and think about anal and vaginal sex in positions other than missionary. They think LGBTQ+. Republicans/Conservatives are the ones who claim to be religious and Anti-LGBTQ+, and they HATE that kind of thing. They want to think of the bride as a humble virgin and that's why they hate those silhouettes.

Conversely, Democrats/Liberals are okay if the bride wears a mermaid, fit-or-flare, or a trumpet silhouette dress. That being said, what Democrats/Liberals would be horrified and it would look like a regular Tuesday at MSNBC/CNN is if the bride came out in a dress with an illusion, grecian, or keyhole neckline. The author suspects the left is aware that the only reason that these tops are only an illusion of being revealing and sexy in any way (it's in the name of one of these necklines for crying out loud). Something that the author has noticed about the left is you are either all for them or you're all against them; there is no in between. Because these are neither sexy nor conservative, the author might be seeing that as a neutrality and are going to accuse her of being "misogynist", "supporting the patriarchy", "supporting the aristocracy", and "trying too hard to be artsy". They also might judge those as "out of touch" because the left tends to support the poverty-stricken more and these styles, or at least the Illusion neckline, tend to be embroidered or otherwise have details that are EXPENSIVE when there are parts of the United States that are one hospital visit or kid going to college away from qualifying for World Vision sponsorships. (It's **REALLY** hard to judge Democrats vs Republicans because the politically correct version is the far left fringe has ideas a ton of people can get behind and you could run into one of them on the street and not know it, politically incorrect version, Democrats hide their crazy better than Republicans do.)

\*There is also some irony based on the choices Democrats/Liberals made that will be seen later in the survey that just occurred to the author.

## 5.6. The Green Party's Choice

These are the survey takers that identify as a member of the Green Party. The hypothesis was that the Green Party would like the smaller silhouettes, such as Column, Slip, Midi, and mini as they tend to use less fabric. Due to how the color white tends to be made by bleach and other chemicals, it was hypothesized that the dress would not be white. It was also hypothesized that the dress would be cotton because that's safer for the environment.

Instead, the people that identified as the Green party were too all over the place to get an idea of which they would like. There was no consensus about the silhouettes and neckline of the bride's gown. There was no consensus on the color and fabric of the bride's gown. There was no consensus on the color and fabric of the bridesmaids' dresses. This is why there is no image for this party.

## 5.7. The First Lady's Choice

This was the bride's choice. It's noted that the bride in this case is fictional. However, this section was included to show how the two main political parties of the United States would agree with the bride. There are three things to keep in mind as you read this. First, the fictional bride is doing two of the things due to a nickname her late father gave her. Second, the bride's favorite color is teal. Third, and finally, she wants to pay homage to her husband's authority over the US

military and was looking for something that not only compliments her dress, but, compliments the formal US military uniforms (if you think that there wouldn't be there, one must ask: what does one assume the President Of The United States' duties include?) Without further ado:



She would like a milk white tulle and lace Princess silhouette with a Queen Anne Neckline for the bridal dress. Now, the Queen Anne Neckline is not really popular on big dresses in the United States. The last time most people remember seeing that particular neckline was either Princess Diana and Prince Charles' wedding or Prince William and Kate Middleton's wedding. In America, the princess silhouette is often confused with the ballgown silhouette, however, there is a difference. For lack of better comparison, to explain this better, imagine the ballgown silhouette and the princess silhouettes as two black women with different but curly hairstyles.

The woman with a perm would be the ballgown silhouette and the one with an afro would be the princess silhouette. For the bridesmaids' dresses, she chose black lace and tulle dresses with teal sashes.

## 5.8. The Libertarian's Choice

This refers to those who took the survey and identified as Libertarian politically. They tend to express strange beliefs from the author's experience, voting for progressive changes (i.e. legal marijuana, LGBTQ+ rights) while expressing anarcho-capitalist views as well (i.e. abolishing fire departments, abolishing the Health Department). As the author saved the color white to recognize Independents, the color used instead for the author to recognize this party was a darker green than the Green Party. From what the author has heard and observed, a ton of Libertarians convert to the Conservative/Republican or the far right party, and members of the GOP try to suck up to them. Also, the author has heard, but is not sure if this is true, anecdote, or slander, but a subset of Libertarians campaign for the lowering of the age of consent from 18.

The Libertarians tend to not care as much as the two main parties about the wedding. When asked about what silhouette, neckline, and fabric of the bride's dress, the Libertarians tended to choose "I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care". When asked about the fabric and color of the bridesmaids' dresses, they also tended to choose "I Don't Know Her Well Enough To Care". One would have the impression that they don't care about the wedding. That being said, observant authors would notice one detail not mentioned in the previous two sentences. When asked about the color of the bride's dress, Libertarians tend to agree on one subject. Oddly, they all seemed to agree that they want to see the dress be the color white.

## 5.9. The Conservative/Republicans' Choice

Now, to start with the stereotypical two political parties of the United States. We will start with the right side of the "spectrum". These are the people that identified as "conservative/Republican". Now, to clarify, these aren't the people who were responsible for the January 6 Capital riots. Your grandmother (from the author's experience) wasn't attacking a police officer. That local pastor didn't scream for the death of the vice president. And, the CEO of your company certainly didn't break into the Capital. If this section seems sparse, it's because it is. It is easier to recontain SCP-106 than get a Republican/Conservative to give their opinion to a multi-opinion survey. Eventually, the author gave up on getting their opinion.



According to the survey, the Republicans would like to see the bride wear a white chiffon A-Line dress with a sweetheart neckline. They would also like to see the bridesmaids wear a dusty rose chiffon dress. Dusty Rose, for the uninformed, is a soft, muted pink, much lighter than bubblegum that goes well with neutral colors. It is similar to mauve. The Republican party seems to have a laissez-faire feeling toward the bridesmaids' dress. However, despite choosing a lighter pink, they were more open to bold colors for the bride's dress and the bridesmaids' dress like pink, black or bright gold. For the wedding, they feel that they need a rose theme. But, they also don't want any political themes or politics.

This party is known for being the conservative. In the nature of the dresses, the party did express this opinion. This party did say they want to see the return of sleeves on dresses, both the brides' and the bridesmaids. However, that being said, this party is open to more modern takes, such as mismatched bridesmaids dresses. The four words to describe the Conservative/Republicans' choices and feelings are: tasteful, pretty, fancy, and sparkly.

One might be wondering why the Conservative/Republicans party would make this decision. The author of this and the survey sincerely does not know. If she had to guess, a gun to her head, she would say most people remember that white and roses are the traditional thing for U.S. weddings. They also remember that pink is the traditional female color. But, that being said, they don't want the bridesmaids to overshadow the bride. However, they are also remembering weddings with multiple colors and ones run by their wealthier friends. Shows like "Say Yes To The Dress" have shown more modern, sleeker dresses and designer gowns that tend to have a little sparkle and that tends to bedazzle people too. They are looking for a new twist on old classics. That is the best explanation she has.

## 5.10. The Far Right/MAGA's Choice

Now, I am not going to go into much detail here. I am doing this because somehow, some way people who identify as this have resources and I don't want this to end my life physically or financially. However, these are the people that either identified as MAGA, put "usa" as their political leaning, or put their political leaning as "50". These are the far right on the spectrum. The author has only one thing to ask these people: Where were you on January 6, 2021?



\*For those wondering, while the author acknowledges that Black/Latinx people voted MAGA/, we all know the only way there was someone at the Capitol Building with skin darker than Crayola Medium Golden who wasn't a cop or politician on January 6, 2021 is if SCP-106 breached containment and joined the melee to steal all the teenage children/young adults there.

Now, as you can tell, it's hard for the author to keep her emotions in check here. So, this will be said fast. The Far Right was all over the place with the bride's dress. They were also all over the place with the bridesmaids' dress color. The author/artist chose red for simplicity's sake. However, there was one thing the far right agreed on. The far right agreed that they want to see a cotton poplin dress. The Author does not know why.

## 5.11. The Liberal/Democrats' Choice

The majority of the people who took the survey either identified as democrats or independents than the other political affiliations. Like was said earlier, the majority of these were female. In fact, some of these were people through the author's experience for how they answered the question "What Is Your Political Identity?" were judged as either Democrat, Liberal or both.



They also took the survey relatively quickly.

The Liberal/Democrats would like to see her in a white satin ball gown, but they could not agree on if it should be a sweetheart neckline or a V-Neck. The bridesmaids were recommended satin navy blue dresses.

Surprisingly, there is a mild schism here. The more liberal the people were, the more likely they were to choose a patriotic idea like a red, white, and blue dress or stars in the veil. The more conservative or centrist Democrat/liberals, while they want something contemporary, agreed with the Republicans on having a rose garden themed weddings, but, the identity of the people getting married really doesn't matter to the person; they would rather the couple be happy.

The Democrats and Liberal were also more laissez-faire about the bride's dress and about letting her choose her own dress, also wishing she chooses something that flatters her body. A-lines and ball gowns were popular, but so were cocktail dresses. They like classical styles, cute details, and are more open to scalloping on the neckline. If the bride's dress wasn't white, they thought it should be either champagne or pink in color. They want to see something that's huge, a bit of a show, and royalty, but not over the top. (If that even makes the tiniest bit of sense!) The three words to describe the Democrat/Liberal's choice would be grand, opulent, and ornate.

Now, like the Conservative/Republican Section, one may be wondering why the Liberal/Democrat party chose this state. Well, also like the Conservative/Republican party, the

author of this report and this survey does not know. If she had to guess, gun to her head, she would guess that the Liberal/Democrat party sees the White House as America's Buckingham Palace. In that way, they also see the President as America's king. (Although Conservatives do see this too; the author experienced this with relatives.) Which means whichever lady the President settles down with is a queen and this is in essence, a royal wedding. The author has also noted that MANY left or far left pages online seem to be Regina George's burn book of everyone who registers republican in the political registration thingy (What it's called escapes the author at the moment.) You may have noticed something the author only noticed while writing this and the next paragraph: while they like the same necklines and colors for the most part, the warring parties kind of chose two completely different things and two completely different feels for these weddings!

That means the author also suspects that it was chosen because some of those who took the survey were seriously thinking "How would Uncle Cletus and Aunt Betty Jean, who vote for Trump every time, collect AK-47s like the author's stepbrother and male coworkers collect Nerf Guns, and live on Chick-Fil-A practically answer these questions?" and they chose the opposite. Republicans choose a style that can easily have sleeves added for Grandma so it's a family affair where no one gets laid? Democrats get a fun adult style that parties hard, Grandma be damned! Republicans want a cute color like pink and a dress with sleeves or one that insists on being bone thin for bridesmaids dresses? Democrats will go for a bold, look-at-me color like Navy Blue or one that does not care about the race or body type of the bridesmaids. Republicans want a smaller dress for hugs, kisses and dancing? Democrats want a dress that's huge so all eyes are on the bride.

## 5.12. The Far Left's Choice

These are the people that when asked about their political identity, said things like "Progressive", "Communist", "Socialist", or "Far Left". These are the people that are the opposite of the Far Right. Some of the current things that are on traditionally Republican's dread list are what some of these tend to fear. In the 1960s, these people were referred to as "hippies". The current motivation for some on the right is to cause these people intentional emotional distress.

Interestingly, the same thing that affected the Far Right almost affected the Far Left, save for an extra decision. The Far Left would love to see the First Lady in a silk ballgown. However, while there was division, it was not division that kept them from choosing. The first thing was they didn't care much. The other thing is that it depended on other details for the bridal dress and the bridesmaids' dress. The far left wants the wedding to be what the couple wants from the evidence the author has. Both the far left and the far right wish to see the dresses be flattering to the brides' body and the bridesmaids' bodies. This unity was hoped for when this survey was originally run.

The author is not sure what the reason for this is, but it's probably because the far left and far right don't appear to have much unity in between them. The Far Right does have some unity, but, if a neonazi catches a KKK member or QAnon catches a Church Of The Creator member there, there will be hands thrown. (Mark the author's words.)

### 5.13. America As A Whole's Choice

Now that the other categories properly had their results read, the author knows that the readers are sitting with some glee at the results. The author can envision some A-List celebrity somewhere in either Los Angeles or New York City snickering and saying something along the lines of “I can’t believe the hicks and the Neo Nazis would like to see the bridesmaids in a Walmart beach dress” in a Tiktok or whatever is the newfangled social media thingamabobber when this comes out. (Their words, not the author’s; the author is terrible with technology) One can imagine some overpaid FOX News host who only has a job because of elderly or bored viewers at four in the morning running a story on how the “Liberals want only too much glamour in weddings and want the darkest looking bridesmaids dresses” after reading this. It’s feasible that one of those male comedians over 40 that has a rant podcast because touring sucks now goes on a tangent about how “The fact that the Republicans want women to wear pink and flowers means they hate women” upon getting this far. It’s also highly possible that one of those far right places in the corners of the internet spouts out “Libtards can’t decide on a dress to wear for a wedding” (Their words, not the author’s) at this point. The author is okay with this as this is human nature.

However, there is another option to consider when thinking about how everyone thinks and perhaps the author started on the wrong paragraph. Perhaps the author should have started this with the last paragraph in the previous section. But, when the author ran this survey, it was

intended to see how the nation would react as a whole. These weren't Republicans or conservatives. These weren't Democrats or Liberals. These were Americans as a whole.

America as a whole wants to see a white satin ball gown with a sweetheart neckline and dusty rose satin bridesmaids dresses.

More than a few people recommended Red, White and Blue or a patriotic theme for the wedding. More than 75 respondents said they want to see the bride wear white, with very few exceptions. When thinking of what designers they had in mind, Carolina Herrera came in first place, Vera Wang came in second place. When there was an essay required for a strange software related reason, the words that came up commonly were "simple" and "conservative". Even liberals who voted for these results described the look as "conservative". 35 different respondents used the term "Traditional". 25 different respondents used the term "Elegant". However, when the author looked this up, Google automatically changed one of the words to "classic".

And, more importantly, the author CAN tell you why this was a thing. This was a thing because it combines the two requests of both the donkey AND the elephant, hence why there is neither in a suit in the last drawing. It's rich, wealthy and a royal, elegant affair with all eyes on the bride on what is her special day (and probably would make the British royal weddings look tiny in



comparison come to think of it.) like the Democrats wanted. But, it's also simple, conservative, can be as full of love as needed to be and makes a full grown woman look to be leaving her childhood behind like the Republicans wanted. It's what BOTH can agree on.

### 5.15. Proposed Solutions

The author would not bring up such obvious problems without proposing some solutions. The author proposes seven solutions to different things that will all bring up a main solution to the main huge problem.

1. **Accept that you cannot completely change someone's opinion; they have to experience it.**
  - a. The majority of people's political views come from their interpretations of facts, how they grew up, and other lifestyle related things that come from experience. It's hard to change someone's view on, say for example, gun control, if they live in an area with poor crime control where the sheriff can't be there. However, it has happened and it happens when they experience new things. For example, how many times have you had someone who grew up in a conservative household who was moderately conservative or MAGA conservative graduate from high school, go to college, and come home for holidays liberal?
2. **Teach repeatedly about beliefs and opinions, have a class about research and misinformation and when it's being used to manipulate. In addition, this class should be required to graduate from high school.**
  - a. It's been a big issue on both sides. The author doesn't know why media literacy isn't taught. But, it seriously needs to be.
3. **The concept of nuance needs to be taught and required to graduate as well.**
  - a. What is "nuance"? That is why we have to teach it in schools. The concept of nuance can best be described with a real life example. Due to the addictive and deadly nature of fentanyl, at the time of writing this, Congress was discussing anti-fentanyl legislation. However, those with medical knowledge know that fentanyl is the best for pain relief for conditions like terminal cancer. Basically, nuance is when an issue has no easy answer or the answer is not going to be easy

for everyone. Knowing this is the way to understand some of the US' top issues (Abortion, Gun Control, The Border) and why we will never solve them.

**4. We also need to teach about political discrimination.**

- a. A little boy wants to play with his friend, but his friend's parents won't let him play with him because his parents are libertarians. A man falls in love with a woman, but his family will not let him marry her because she and her family are Republicans. A boy gets expelled from school because his parents are Progressives and he "might be a bad influence for the other kids". A man goes to an event with an AR-15 and slaughters a ton because the majority of people attending were Liberal Democrats. All of these are terrible because they are prejudicial. Think of them as the equivalent of a black couple waking up to a burning cross on their lawn or a Jewish kid seeing a swastika on the door. It's evil, and the reason the founding fathers HATED political parties, or at least George Washington did. (More on this later on.)

**5. My red is not your red. We must touch the elephant.**

- a. Basically, this means we might not see things the same way. Not all Conservatives/Republicans are antiLGBTQ, pro-gun, and pro-life. Not all Liberals/Democrats are proLGBTQ, anti gun, and prochoice. That's not how everyone sees the facts. We must realize that not everyone that is a way thinks the same way and stop listening to the extremists (the extremist advice is so obvious and applies to other things the author decided to not include it as advice), and realize that the old nonAbrahamic-religion from part of the world that includes India because the author heard this was Sikh but other sources are saying it was Jain, Hindu or Buddhist but translated by a white guy because the Abrahamic God neglected to put this in the Bible/Torah/Koran for some reason and it's a good rule of thumb moral parable of the blind men and the elephant. **7. We need to realize that all politicians are humans and, more importantly, liars that don't care about you at all.**

- a. When a politician does something we don't like, we need to keep this in mind. If a politician says something, they only want certain peoples' votes. A Democrat supporting BLM might only want the black vote and not agree with their demands. A Republican forcing his family to carry AK-47s for a Christmas photo might actually support stricter gun laws believe it or not. (And, for that matter, how are guns THAT cheap?!) It's like a teenage boy promising to marry a girl for oral sex; he's not going to do that, he just wants the sex act.

**8. Here are some things to do with the political nature and the current media landscape that might help in general:**

- a. **Accept that most mainstream television/cable news shows don't care about the United States of America's fate.** There are pro-life employees of CNN and MSNBC and prochoice employees at OAN and FOX News. However, these people REALLY don't care about who wins the elections. They only want the money that comes with viewers. It's sad because in the beginning, they cared about journalistic integrity. But, now, the author wonders if half the politicians are only doing what they do because the outlets won't hire journalism graduates. **Hire journalists and not politicians for the news.**
- b. **The problem you see is that there's only two sides in this country unlike other democratic countries.** Canada has three main political parties. The author is not completely sure about Great Britain, but, they are sure there's more than that. The problem is that in the US they assume you are either one party or the other because of this and when the parties run, they refuse to be there for the win.
- c. **Here's how the author is proposing to solve this particular problem as even people from the United Kingdom have pointed this out:** Instead of just two political parties on the ballot, it should be lined up on a sign in a public or online forum for the parties that run. Instead of two parties to choose from with a write-in section, there should be at least nine different parties on this sign that lists their parties' stances under them on a menu like an ice cream menu. (I'm not kidding you; I would provide a photo of an ice cream menu, but, it won't make sense in context.) The candidates should also be present to hear the results as well.
- d. **Finally, America as a nation needs to focus on things other than political affiliation when voting and in daily life.** The author has volunteered at the food bank for years at this point. Celebrities in these countries don't really bring it up often enough for it not to be a scandal when brought up. It is also why the author is glad that she did it this way because this way they weren't thinking about politics and thinking about what other people think about, or something caring.

## 6. Conclusion

It can be concluded that this nation is divided by politics to a severe degree. However, we still as a society share that we want a love scene in our dresses and a conservative style with some traditions. We as Americans want to see some purity even if the bride has not met a portion of our society's standards of virginity. But, it can be said that having a strong hobby outside of politics can help ease some of the political tension and go back to the ways we were in the past. We have determined that if you have a Democratic relative helping you plan a heteronormative wedding, prepare for some indecision.
