<u>Pear Deck</u> allows your google slides to be interactive, letting students answer questions in real time, labeling on a diagram and more recently students can go through slides at their own pace. There is a slight learning curve here but we've linked some videos to help you navigate it. Don't be deterred by the pricing plan, the free plan has amazing features that allows you to take your lessons up a notch.

How Does Pear Deck Work - Regular google slides you share your screen on zoom and students are essentially watching your slides, in pear deck you create a code and students have access to your slides.

<u>Pear Deck for PowerPoint</u> - Pear deck allows you to share slides from Google and PowerPoint.

Pear Deck Training Sessions - Pear Deck also has weekly training sessions.
