Definition

Open educational resources are "teaching, learning, and research resources that are free of cost and access barriers, and which also carry legal permission for open use"


Scholarly Publishing and Academic Resources Coalition (SPARC)

This allows you to...

- Retain: make, own, and control copies of the content
- Reuse: use the content in a wide range of ways
- **Revise:** the right to adapt, adjust, modify, or alter the content itself
- **Remix:** combine the original or revised content with other material to create something new
- Redistribute: share copies of the original content, your revisions, or your remixes with others

Why is this important? What are some benefits of OER for you or your students?

Creative Commons License Elements
Attribution: give attribution to the creator
NonCommercial: limits reuse to non-commercial purposes
NoDerivatives: prohibits sharing adaptations of the work
ShareAlike: shared adaptations must be made available under the same license
