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1. Introduction

This Report on Status Report on Compensation, site clearance, and Resettlement has been prepared in accordance with the Terms of Reference with the Technical Assistance (TA) consultant¹. The purpose is to provide a snapshot of the progress toward completion of the site clearance, requirements and the implementation of the Resettlement and Ethnic Minorities Development Plan (REMDP).

This report is for the Ngoc Lac subproject, updated by 31 July 2023.




Figure 1: Ngoc Lac subproject - construction works

Activities for compensation, land clearance and resettlement are required in conjunction with the investment works of the subproject as listed in **Table 1** and shown in **Figure 1**.

Assessment of Compensation and Resettlement 2. Requirements

2.1. Overview

Social safeguard policy documents reflecting the scope of the project's compensation and site clearance impacts have been prepared in stages, including:

- Resettlement Policy Framework² (RPF): The initial Resettlement Action Plan (RAP) 2019;
- Resettlement Action Plan³ (RAP): Initial preparation of a draft RAP in 2020.
- Updated RAP, referred to as the Resettlement and Ethnic Minorities Development Plan (REMDP): Initially submitted to AFD on 28/04/2023 and then revised based on AFD's comments from 07/07/2023. Revised document submitted to AFD on 18/07/2023. NOL for the REMDP was issued by AFD on 26/7/2023, in its document ref. NLA [D277]

The resettlement impacts estimated at each stage are summarized in Table 2. Based on the initial RAP, the estimated cost of compensation of 24,376 million VND was converted to Euros and included in the Credit Facility Agreement⁴. The cost of compensation was estimated to be €927,832 to be paid with counterpart funds.

2.2. Preparation of the REMDP

The PMU commissioned consultants to prepare an REMDP which was based on the construction footprint from the detailed design and a detailed measurement survey (DMS) conducted in December 2022. The REMDP was initially submitted to AFD on 28/04/2023 and then revised based on AFD's comments from 07/07/2023. The revised document was submitted to AFD on 18/07/2023. NOL for the REMDP was issued by AFD on 26/7/2023, in its document ref. NLA [D277]

Preparation of the REMDP takes into account the available DMS results as well as information from a socio-economic survey and consultations with local authorities, communities, and affected households.

DMS results show that: there are 334 affected households, including 204 (61%) ethnic minority households. No households need to be relocated and resettled. A total of 248,247m² of land is affected, of which 219,977m² is residential land, 27,890m² is public land, and a small amount (379m²) is other land for organizations.

The estimated cost of compensation of 24,364 million VND converts to an equivalent cost in Euro of approximately €967,000 (exchange rate of 25,200, July 2023), only slightly different from the amount in Euro included in the Loan Agreement of €927,832.

A Livelihood and Income Restoration Plan (LIRP) has been prepared to restore conditions for severely affected households and vulnerable groups. Supporting activities will be based on a needs assessment survey, and will include vocational training, access to capital via loans, and job creation.

2.3. Responsibilities for REMDP implementation and monitoring

The PMU and Ngoc Lac District Compensation, Assistance, and Resettlement Board (DCARB) have overall responsibility for implementation of the REMDP, including providing compensation and overseeing support, and resettlement.

Implementation of the REMDP is monitored by a Resettlement Independent Monitoring Consultant (R-IMC). The procurement of this consultant is expected to be completed in Q3/2023. During implementation, the R-IMC will provide monitoring reports every 6-months.

3. REMPD Implementation Status

3.1. General Progress of Compensation and Resettlement

At the moment, the subproject has 12.44 ha of cleared sites.

3.2. Site Cleared under previous Projects

The project have 12,44 ha cleared site from the other project.

3.3. Gender Issues

Men and women are equally involved in the project's compensation and site clearance process, as required by the sponsor.

3.4. Social Risk

The subproject has not commenced construction, so there is no social negative impact on the local communities.

3.5. Livelihood Restoration Program

Because the DMS process has not been completed, there is no complete list of severely affected households and affected households belonging to the vulnerable group, so a livelihood restoration program has not been developed for the subproject.

At the moment, only displaced households and households losing over 30% of their productive land holding are identified. Those losing from 20-29% of their productive land holding (10-29% for vulnerable households) have not been identified. The TA Consultant has drawn the attention of Ngoc Lac PMU on identifying severely affected households as per the Project's RPF and Livelihood Restoration Program.

3.6. Ethnic Minorities

Of the affected households 204 (or 61%) are ethnic minority households (from Muong, Dao, Thai peoples) but none of these lose more than 10% of their production area or need to be displaced. A socio-economic survey shows that the ethnic minority households have a similar livelihood, culture, and lifestyle to the Kinh people in the area, and are not disproportionately affected by the project.

The affected EM households have been consulted and provided suitable compensation and support entitlements as per the project's policies. However, the support for vulnerable groups has not been applied.

3.7. Settlement of Complaints or Grievances

The REMDP describes a formal process for potentially affected people to register a complaint or grievance with the compensation or resettlement process. Complaints can initially be sent verbally or in writing to the People's Committee of the commune/town or Ngoc Lac District DCARB, who shall respond and seek an agreeable solution. If this can not be achieved the issue can be brought to the PPC for final resolution.

Until now, 110 AHs and 1 affected organization included in the name lists of Decisions No.1828, 2269, 2719 and 2258 have received compensation payment, and none of them filled any complaint.

4. Conclusion and Next Steps

Overall, it is concluded that the subproject has prepared the REMDP and established a resettlement mechanism that is fully compliant with the CRUIV project RPF and Vietnam's regulations. The REMDP has received AFD's NOL ref. NLA 277 dated 26 Jul 2023.

Progress with resettlement actions is well advanced and is expected to be completed in Q4/2023.

The next steps and expected time frame are listed in Table 4.
