Paper Presentation Groups

Sessions are 55 minutes in length. Each presenter has 10-12 minutes for their presentation, followed by 5-6 minutes for feedback and questions. This may happen in 1 of 2 ways depending on the presenters' and moderators' mutual preference:

- 1. Student presents for 10-12 minutes. Moderator keeps time. Then 5-6 minutes of questions and feedback from the moderators and or other presenters. This goes the same for the next 2 rounds of presenters. With any time left after the last round, the moderators may want to make final comments.
- 2. Student presents for 10-12 minutes. Moderator keeps time. Then go directly to the next 2 presenters. After the last presenter, moderators can facilitate 20 minutes of questions and feedback for the presenters and end with any final comments.

Each room will have the capability to display your presentation on a monitor or projector screen via HDMI cord. Please provide your own computer (and adapter if needed).
