Environmental Justice Resources in North Carolina

Water Testing Resources

Certain areas in NC experience dangerous levels of lead, hog waste, and other toxins that get into waterways and can cause serious adverse health problems. Testing your drinking water quality is important to identify potential toxins that you might be consuming.

- Clean Water for Carolina Kids
 - Enroll your Child Care Center/Family Child Care Home to test water for lead levels
 - View publicly reported data
 - You can search your childcare center by county and see if they have public data available for lead concentration in their waters

 - Videos on how to enroll in their clean water program, how to sample for lead in the water, understanding the results of your water tests, how to use the public data map on their website, how to install and maintain a water filter, how to replace a faucet, and more.

Air Quality Resources

Communities of color and low-income communities in NC have higher levels of air pollutants due to redlining (click here for a definition of redlining) and other forms of systemic racism. Air pollutants can lead to higher risks for asthma, respiratory issues, lung disease, and cancer. Understanding your exposure to air pollutants and possible solutions can protect your health.

- NC Air Quality Portal
 - This map shows the air quality index (AQI) by county; higher the AQI numbers mean higher levels of air pollution
 - PM2.5 AQI: PM2.5 are small particles that stay in the air and long-term exposure lead to higher risk of birth defects in newborns, heart attack, stroke, and more
 - Ozone AQI: converts the ozone concentration in the air to a scale of 0-500
 - Action Day: an action day is when the AQI goes into a dangerous range; if it is an action day, one should reduce exposure by avoiding going outside for long periods of time or exercising outdoors
 - Burn Day: a burn day is when outdoor burning is allowed at sanctioned outdoor burning areas

 - 0-50 is good
 - 51-100 is moderate
 - 101-150 is unhealthy for sensitive groups
 - 151-200 is unhealthy, 201-300 is very unhealthy
 - 301 or higher is hazardous

Legal Aid Services

Here is a list of where to find legal aid and pro bono services in NC relating to environmental law. Individuals might seek legal aid to fight corporations such as Smithfield from polluting their water or to increase/improve the environmental protections sanctioned by the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) among other things.

- Land Loss Prevention Project
 - Organization in Durham that provides free legal assistance to low-income landowners and limited resource family farmers

Legal Aid of NC

- Statewide nonprofit law center that provides free legal services in civil matters to low-income people

- To give an example of their services, this organization has helped victims of natural disasters with housing problems and insurance issues
- Charlotte Center for Legal Advocacy
 - Offers free legal assistance both in and outside of Charlotte
 - To give an example of their services, this organization helps clients access healthcare through Medicaid
