

With so many changes recently, one of our UCIEP partners shared these projections on nonimmigrant visas. ProPublica seems to have gotten hold of a US DOS cable/memo indicating that Consular Affairs is predicting an 82% decrease in nonimmigrant visa applications for 2021. This includes student, tourist, and business visa applications. Cuts are being made to Embassy and Consulate staffs. More limited staffing is predicted to increase wait times, etc., for interviews and visa processing. Our field is in for another difficult year.
