

Camp Sinawa Rules

- RESPECT! If we all respect the land, the property, the wildlife, each other and ourselves, we will have a beautiful camp to experience and enjoy for generations to come!
- Your dogs are welcome at camp but must be kept on a leash and you will be expected to pick up after them. They are not allowed in the shower house or lodge. You are responsible for any damage caused by them.
- Stay on designated walking paths and hiking trails.
- There are 200 wooded acres on the other side of Sinawa Road that you are welcome to enjoy but PLEASE NOTE: Lands enrolled under Managed Forest Law as "open" to public access allow for hunting, fishing, hiking, biking, sight seeing and cross country skiing. Camping and operating motorized vehicles are only allowed with permission from the ranger. It is your responsibility to be aware of hunting season dates and be cautious hiking in land that is open to hunters.
- Be responsible and conservative with your water usage.
- Nothing other than waste and toilet paper can be flushed.
- Fires are permitted in designated fire rings only and must be completely extinguished each night.
- Quiet time is from 10:00 p.m. until 8:00 a.m.
- Leave camp as clean (or cleaner) than you find it. Cleaning supplies are provided for your use.
- You are responsible for recycling and emptying trash cans that you use.
- No firearms are allowed in camp.
- Park only in designated areas. The road must be free and clear in the event that an emergency vehicle should need access.
- Neither fires nor camping are allowed on the island.
