Overdue: The Value of School Librarians Discussion Guide

This guide provides examples of questions that a facilitator can use to engage viewers with the topic.

Questions to ask before watching the film: The facilitator should encourage viewers to write their answers down and provide paper and pens if possible.

- 1. What comes to mind when you hear the words "school librarian?" Are there any specific words, images, or experiences you associate with the position?
- 2. What comes to mind when you hear the words "school library?" Are there any specific words, images, or experiences you associate with this place?
- 3. What do you think are the most important things children and teens learn or be doing while at school?

Questions to ask after watching the film

- 1. After watching Overdue: The Value of School Librarians, has your perception of school librarians shifted or changed? If so, how?
- What surprised you most about Overdue: The Value of School Librarians?
- 3. After watching Overdue: The Value of School Librarians, how might your future actions in your school, community, or state change in response to the short film?
- 4. If a school librarian position was being eliminated in your community, how might you use Overdue: The Value of School Librarians to advocate for that position?
- 5. What do you think are the most important things children and teens learn or do while at school? In what ways do school librarians contribute to these important topics?
