Dear Stone Mill Parents:

We are all invigorated and ready to start a new and fantastic school year! We have been cleaning and shining everything in the building. We have all new cafeteria line equipment in our kitchen, a new oven and new electrical lines to make it all fantastic! And taking the suggestion of our amazing student government association (SGA) last year, we have added privacy dividers in the boys' bathrooms. The school looks amazing and is ready for everyone to come in and learn, learn, learn!

One of the things I love about the beginning of the school year is that I know many, many new things will happen, and I cannot ever predict what they will be. It's always so thrilling to see what each year brings! 😊 I am excited to take this journey with you and your children!

This year our bell schedule will be:

9:05 – Children can come on school grounds (no adult supervision prior to this time)
9:15 – First bell and children can enter the school
9:25 – Late bell and instruction begins
3:45 – Walkers and car circle dismissed
3:50 – Buses loaded as they arrive

Again this year, children who are brand-new to Stone Mill are invited to spend the day with us on Monday, August 24, 2026 as a way to “transition” into our school. Students will be meeting the teachers, specialists and staff. They will learn where the bathrooms are, where the gym is, what the rules at recess are, etc. At 2:15 on that day, (so we don't lose anyone in the Open House rush of parents and current students), all “transition” day kiddos will be moved into non-classroom spaces in our building. We will have signs up so you will know where to find your children. If you are the parent of a brand-new, Stone Mill child, and you are attending the Open House, you will need to swing by and sign your child out so everyone is under adult supervision at all times. 😊 If you have a child coming to Stone Mill for the first time and you'd like him/her to attend “Transition Day,” please fill out the Google form if you haven't: <https://forms.gle/nJWiiUcJmuMGSKCA6>

The entire staff is looking forward to a wonderful year of working in partnership with you. We encourage all parents to take an active role in the school and to communicate regularly with the staff at Stone Mill. (Just as a quick reminder, MCPS does NOT allow students to carry or wear any device able to communicate with parents, caregivers or anyone in the outside world).

We continue to protect the students by limiting access to the school. When adults come to drop off something for a child, to drop off or pick up a child outside of regular hours, etc. like last year, adults will be asked to ring the doorbell, and a school staff member will respond. Only

children will be routinely allowed in the building. Parents will please remain outside. This is for general safety. As for helping in the classroom (after things get underway), teachers will be able to have volunteers in the classrooms, by appointment only. Each day the office will have a list of people and times to expect them. Everyone who volunteers will need to have current Child Abuse and Neglect training. We will still be using our automated, phone/text Parent Square and email communication systems where we call and inform families about important events at Stone Mill. So, if you get a recorded message from Stone Mill, please stay on the line to hear the updates. When you receive an email that says, "No Reply" that's not spam. Please read everything from me, the teachers and from the school.

TRANSITION DAY

Monday, August 24 is Montgomery County Public Schools' Transition Day. Kindergarten to grade 5 students who will be coming to Stone Mill ES for the VERY FIRST time are invited to learn about rules and procedures. Parents can choose to join their children at 2:15 for the open house to drop off school supplies and to meet the teacher. Children whose parents do not come for the open house will go home (walking, bus, or car circle) at 3:45.

Note the following:

- Students who are new to Stone Mill ES are invited.
- Houses 1.1 miles away will have busing as usual.
- Regular school hours - 9:15am to 3:45pm.

First Instructional Day of School is Tuesday, August 25, 2026 for all students. We look forward to seeing you then!

NEW STUDENT PARENT INFORMATION MEETING

We will be holding a short, informational parent meeting for parents new to Stone Mill at the start of the school Open House, **August 24th at 1:45 pm.** The meeting is for families who are fully registered with the school. There will be a separate line-up for parents attending the meeting in our cafeteria and you can come in, hear the information (about 20 minutes), and then attend the Open House. If your child is spending the day with us for “Transition Day” you can meet your child and sign him/her out to attend the Open House with you.

CLASS ASSIGNMENTS

As always, we will be posting class assignments on our home page. The children will be listed by first name and last initial. You will be able to see the entire class when you visit the site! The classes will be posted by 4 pm on Friday, August 21st. (Because the school system requires us to assign a child to a teacher for the fall in June, class assignments on ParentVUE are not accurate). OPEN HOUSE

The annual **Open House** for all PreK – 5 students and parents will be on **Monday, August 24, 2026, from 2:15 – 3:15 pm.**

The Open House is a time for students to see the school, meet their teachers, find their new classrooms, and meet some of their classmates. This is a great time to drop off school supplies! Teachers will be available to greet students, and will not be discussing programs or specifics about children.

A formal presentation on curriculum for all classes will occur at our **Back-to-School Night, Thursday, September 10, 2026, immediately following the PTA meeting at 5:30-6:00.** The grade 3 - 5 presentations will be from 6:00-6:45 PM and Pre-K to 2 presentations will be from 6:50-7:30 PM. There will not be a virtual option. This timing is earlier than in years' past.

ENROLLMENT

Summer is a busy time at Stone Mill as we continue to enroll new students and say goodbye to children who are moving. If you have new neighbors who have not yet enrolled their child(ren), please encourage them to contact the school office as soon as possible.

CELL PHONES/COMMUNICATION DEVICES FOR CHILDREN

Children are not allowed to communicate with the outside world (that includes family, sorry) during the school day. Our focus must be on instruction and the tasks at hand. If your child has a cell phone, Apple watch, Gizmo, or any other device that allows either one-way or two-way communication, it must be off and in the backpack during the school day. If it rings during the day, is pulled out of the backpack during the day, or is used in any fashion, an adult will hold it for you to pick up and not send in again.

Some parents have expressed the desire to track/monitor their child during the school day. Should you want to have a tracker that has NO communication abilities (Like an Apple Air Tag), that is perfectly fine to have in the backpack. AngelSense devices and other items that can be activated to listen in and/or communicate even in a parent-to-child fashion, even if the child cannot reply back, are not allowed. Devices that can be activated remotely or at-will cannot be worn. No devices: even in “school mode.”

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS AT SCHOOL

Parents often enjoy dropping off treats (food or non-food – not both) for the class to celebrate his/her child's birthday. Classroom birthday celebrations are for the children at the lunchroom table. Because the celebrations are quite brief and occur during the workday for families, parents are asked to drop off the treats and have a separate family celebration at home if desired.

Again this year **summer** birthdays will be celebrated on the child's half birthday. For example, if your child's birthday is August 1st, he/she can celebrate in the classroom on February 1st. PLEASE contact your child's teacher prior to dropping off any treats.

Also, please keep in mind the following rules for what to bring in:

- All foods MUST be store bought with the ingredient label still on. (We have children with life-threatening allergies and need to know what items are entering the school).
- If your child has allergies to foods, please let our health tech, Romina Donolo, know and consider sending in non-perishable treats or treats (like baked goods) that can be frozen to store in the health room for your own child. No child with documented allergies will be given foods that are sent in by others for birthdays. As I cannot guarantee a child with allergies safety to foods brought in by others, I will not risk lives for birthday treats.
- **No juice, balloons, whole cakes with knives to cut them, treats that need freezing or refrigeration or homemade foods are allowed.**
- Treats should be small and easy to eat.
- Small non-food treats or small non-food items are only allowed if that is the only treat. Non-food treats cannot be given in addition to a food treat.
- **Birthday party invitations for parties outside of school can NOT be passed out at Stone Mill** (unless you are inviting every single person in the class).

SNACK AND WATER

Many classes invite children to have a snack sometime during the instructional day in the classroom. Snack is optional and, if desired, to be brought from home. The school does not provide snacks for children.

We have working, safe, water fountains for children who don't bring a water bottle for the day and bottle-filling stations for those who do.

LUNCH PROGRAM

School lunch menus will be available on the web. Breakfast and lunch must be paid for either by check, cash or at MySchoolBucks.com. Breakfast is \$1.60 and lunch costs \$2.85. There are no longer PIN numbers, but rather children will be using the same login that they already use for the library, computer, and online payment system. Peanut Butter/Jelly is offered at lunch daily. We are not sure what will replace the Grilled Cheese as it's no longer being sold in MCPS. Families needing financial assistance to pay for school lunch (lunches from home are certainly allowed), must fill out the application form for Free and Reduced Benefits.

Nut and Seed Free Table - This year we will again be having a "Nut/Seed Free" table in the cafeteria. Children who have life-threatening allergies to peanuts, tree nuts and/or seeds will be able to sit at this table daily. The children can have non-allergic friends sit with them at the table, but the friends' lunches must be peanut, nut and seed free for that day. Should your child have an allergy and you would prefer your child to sit with his/her class, simply send a note to the office letting us know. Children cannot move back and forth between the two tables. A family must decide which table is the better option for their child.

TRANSPORTATION

Bus routes will have changed since last year. The MCPS website says that they will be publishing a schedule later this month (link below), so instead for now, please look to see your child's bus information on ParentVUE.

Children who live beyond 1.1 miles or across a busy street (Like Travilah) get a school bus. Children who live within 1.1 miles from the school and have a safe walking route to the school do not receive bus transportation. Children who are enrolled under a “Change of School Assignment” do not receive bus transportation. MCPS does not permit children who are “walkers” to instead go to a nearby bus stop and take that bus to school. MCPS also does not allow children to cross a street in order to board a bus. For example, children listed for bus #5311 (blue bus) will say, “Lake Winds Way and Settlers Landing Way – RSO.” RSO stands for right side only. Children who live on the opposite side of the street are not to cross the road in order to receive bus transportation or to pick up a bus at an earlier or later time than the one assigned to your home. We have had some difficulty with too many children riding buses to avoid walking, and it is unsafe to cross roads in traffic to catch a bus. Any child needing to ride a non-assigned bus in order to visit a friend after school for a play date will need a written note from home that will have to be approved and signed in our main office once it is determined that a seat is available.

Parents who drive their children to school can begin dropping them off starting at **9:05 A.M.** **NO adult supervision will be present prior to 9:05.** It is essential that children be safe in the front lot, so please drop your child off on the sidewalk at the car circle. Children should NOT be discharged in the lot. They should only be discharged onto the sidewalk at the car circle. We do not want children to have to walk among moving vehicles. Please remember that we have two lanes in the car circle: one for dropping children off and one for leaving the lot. After your child is dropped off safely onto the curb, please pull into the outside lane so that other cars can move up and we can unload as many children as possible. **For the safety of the children, please NEVER move the barrels at the end of the lanes. We need to keep traffic flowing in a predictable and safe pattern.** Finally, all children are to be safely transported as above. Stopping, dropping up or picking up children on the side street, Quietwood Drive, is not allowed. Please obey all traffic signs posted on school grounds and the surrounding area. (Please see the attached traffic pattern map).

KINDERGARTEN TRANSPORTATION

With full-day Kindergarten, no special transportation is provided for our Kindergarten students. However, safety patrols will be on duty to assist walking children in crossing intersections. All children, including Kindergarten students, who live in areas where bus transportation is regularly provided, may ride the buses (see above). Walkers should walk with peers, and very young children should find an older, school-aged buddy to walk with.

Since the transportation of students is a very complex operation for the first few weeks of school, I encourage you to wait with your child for the bus to arrive, to be at the designated stop when the bus returns, and to allow ample waiting time until the schedule has been refined.

SCHOOL HOURS

The Stone Mill instructional day officially begins at 9:25 A.M. **Children will be permitted to enter the building and move to their classrooms at the 9:15 A.M. bell.** If your child is a

walker, please assist him/her in planning what time to leave so that he/she arrives between 9:05 and 9:20. If you drive your child or your child takes a bus to school, he/she will be permitted to enter the building as early as 9:15. Should a bus or walker arrive slightly earlier, the children will be asked to wait in grade level lines at the front door until the prescribed time. **There is no adult supervision earlier than 9:05, so please have your walkers arrive on time rather than early. Children cannot be left without an adult prior to 9:05.** Children being driven to school can begin to arrive at 9:05. The car circle is pretty empty between 9:05 and 9:15. All students entering after 9:25 A.M. need to have his/her parent ring the bell for the child to gain entry.

CROSSING GUARD HOURS - The Montgomery County Police, School Safety Unit is gearing up for the start of another safe and successful school year! **Our crossing guard's post times will be as follows: Stonebridge View Drive (Front of School) - 8:55 - 9:25 am and 3:45 – 4:15 pm.**

All K-5 and PEP full day students will be dismissed at 1:15 P.M. after lunch.

IMMUNIZATIONS

Please make sure we have a copy of your child’s immunizations. You can email the information to the school as soon as possible if you haven’t already. **Students in grades K-5 are required to have two measles immunizations.**

RECOGNIZING AND REPORTING CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT TRAINING

In order to be allowed to volunteer, Recognizing and Reporting Child Abuse and Neglect Training MUST be completed. It is an online module that takes about 30 minutes and is available on the Stone Mill and MCPS websites. The training is valid for three years. Once you complete the training, please email your confirmation number to me so that we can ensure your name is on our list. The training is offered through your ParentVUE account.

HOME SCHOOL COMMUNICATION

We want to ensure that home and school are communicating regularly! It is very important that you provide us with accurate email addresses, cell phone numbers, home numbers and work numbers so that the health room, main office and teachers are able to communicate with you effectively and efficiently. In addition, as in previous years, you will be receiving the “Student Emergency Information” form AND can instead do the form online in ParentVUE. When you provide or update your information, please be sure to check that your telephone numbers are correct when you return the form to the school. It is the home number on this form that our phone system calls to provide you with updated information.

WE NEED PHONE NUMBERS TO REACH YOU AT WORK DURING THE DAY

Our health room will only call you at work in the event of a health emergency. We will not use your work number for recorded calls or other non-time sensitive issues. Too often parents will not list a work number, and we’ll have a child with a raging fever in the health room for hours because we can’t reach a parent on his/her cell. For the health and well-being of your children, please make sure we have numbers to reach you during the workday.

SICK CHILDREN – PLEASE KEEP THEM HOME

It is our goal at Stone Mill to keep our school open and our children healthy. This was true prior to COVID. This is even more important now. Should your child(ren) have fever and/or vomiting, sore throat, cold symptoms, or cough, PLEASE keep him/her/them home and consult with your doctor. It is NOT acceptable to give your child(ren) Tylenol, Motrin, Advil, or any other fever reducer in the morning and send the child to school for the day. As a working parent myself, I truly understand how difficult it can be to miss work to stay home with a sick child. As an educator, I also understand the importance of children coming to school in order to keep up with the rigorous curriculum. All that being said, it will help your child and the entire school for sick children to stay at home until they are fever and vomit free for a full 24 hours. By keeping your sick children home, you are helping to keep our school open for everyone. If you need to talk to the health tech, please call 240-740-5452. Thanks in advance for your help!

ONLINE PAYMENT FOR FIELD TRIPS, ETC. – Payment for all field trips happens electronically with credit and debit cards in a program is called, “SchoolCash Online.” (Please note that the SchoolCash Online payment system is NOT related to school cafeteria accounts) SchoolCash Online helps parents/guardians and community members pay school-related fees safely, quickly, and easily. SchoolCash Online will help increase efficiency and security at schools by making payments directly into schools’ bank accounts and eliminating the need for teachers to handle money. As always, we will not be assigning patrols at intersections beyond where the crossing guard can see the children. There will be no patrols present at the intersections farther from the school down Stonebridge View Drive. As always, parents should please advise their children on safe crossing techniques and the importance of walking to school in groups. Patrols may pick up their belts from our patrol sponsors Ms. Lee and Mrs. Paschall during the open house up in the fifth-grade hallway. Just FYI, outdoor patrol duties begin at 9:00 and indoor patrols at 9:05.

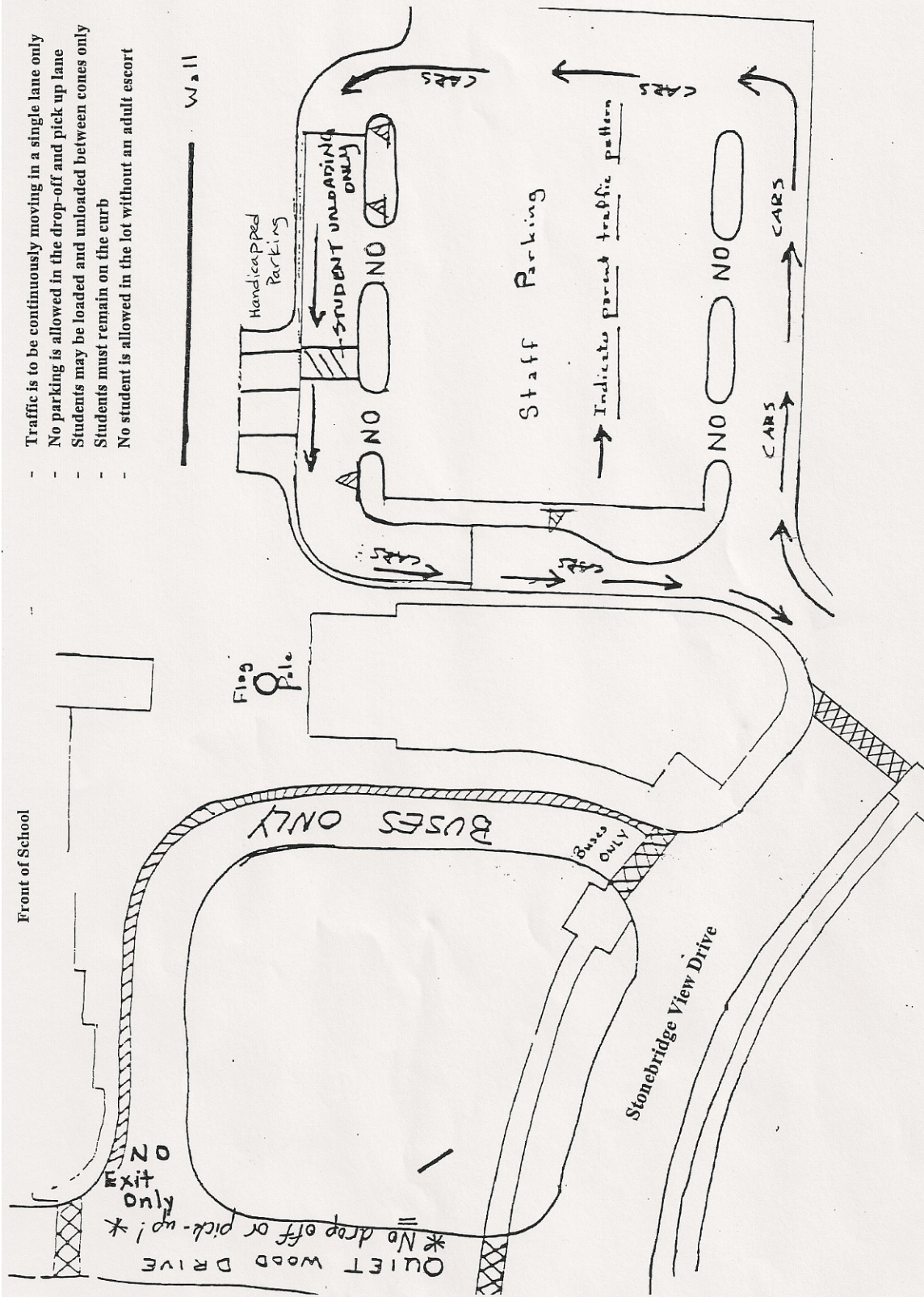
