We are off to a great start here at HMS! 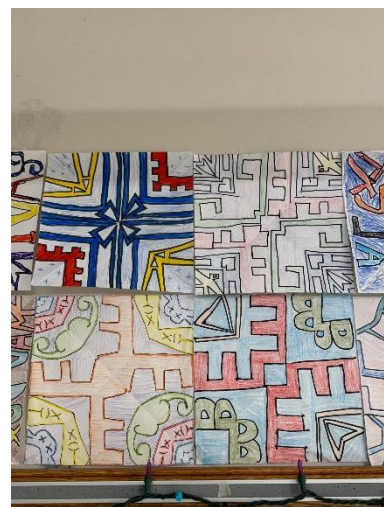
ELA with Dr. Shurtleff

The first few days of school always go by so quickly! In ELA, we shared picture slides and stories in order to get to know each other. We also created short stories based on a picture of a cave, a group of people, a bicycle, and a burrito. Our stories were interesting and sometimes funny! Next, we set up our binders and moved onto reviewing literary elements and figurative language skills. We made flashcards and completed numerous activities. The students made "I am..." poems and participated in review stations with groups. We will begin reviewing how to punctuate dialogue and begin our Mystery Unit soon.

Math with Mrs. Sogn

Welcome back!! We started the year discussing numbers, graphing information about themselves, and writing their name to create a design. I have attached some pictures. See what names you find!

After organizing their binders on Monday, we started the first unit on integers. The students were told to bring their binders home every night. They have notes, titled Sogn's Step by Step Skills, in the first section which are great to reference if they are stuck! By the end of this week, students will have reviewed how to evaluate expressions using order of operations and begun the first unit on Integers! Next week we will begin adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing positive and negative numbers.



Science with Mrs. Reilly

Hello Families!

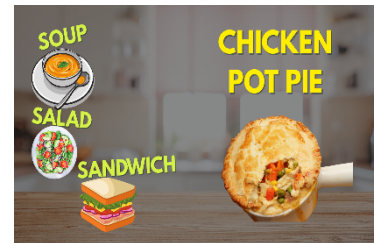
It has been an absolute joy getting to know your children during these first few days of school. We have hit the ground running with hands-on exploration, and I am so impressed by the curiosity and collaborative spirit our students have already shown!

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Our first STEM challenge tasked students with an engineering puzzle: creating a bridge using only a single index card and four books as "land." The goal was to see how much weight (in pennies) their design could support. It was wonderful to see students iterate on their designs, constantly challenging themselves to improve their stability and load-bearing capacity! We also dove into the "Black Box" activity, where students learned about systems that cannot be seen directly. By listening to and feeling a steel ball roll inside a sealed container, students had to model and draw what they believed the internal design looked like. The reveal of the actual patterns was a highlight, sparking great discussions about scientific modeling and observation.

To sharpen our logic skills, we explored the "Soup, Salad, or Sandwich" debate. This fun lesson served as an introduction to the **CER (Claim, Evidence, Reasoning)** framework. Students had a blast categorizing everyday foods by making a claim, supporting it with evidence, and explaining their reasoning. This fundamental skill will be the backbone of our lab reports all year long.

Get ready to power up! Next week, we begin our exciting new unit on **Energy**. We look forward to another week of discovery!



Social Studies with Mr. O'Hara

Welcome back!

We have had a wonderful start to the school year in Social Studies. During our first few days, students focused on getting to know one another, learning classroom routines, and becoming familiar with the skills we will use throughout the year. We have begun practicing how to analyze maps, examine historical sources, and use evidence to support our ideas.

As we move forward, students will continue with our first unit (Greece) and explore the ancient world. We will investigate how geography, culture, government, and resources influenced the development of Ancient Greece. Students will have many opportunities to participate in discussions, collaborate with classmates, and think critically about the people and events that shaped our world. Looking towards next week, we will begin discussions about the beginnings of Democracy. I hope you enjoy Labor Day weekend with your families!

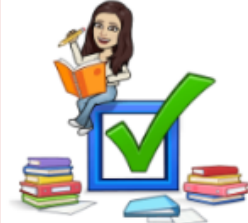
Purple Team

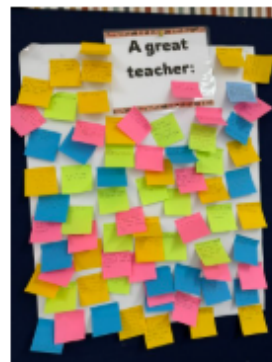
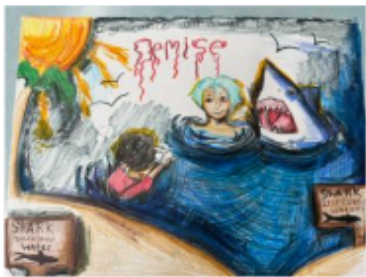

The past two weeks we have spent getting to know each other and the routines, rituals and expectations of the classroom. We began by creating common expectations around what students think makes a great teacher, a great ELA class, a great student and how each student learns best. In a Graffiti Wall activity, students posted anonymous sticky notes sharing their thoughts on these topics, which provided a foundation for mutual understanding and respect in this classroom. Then, we worked on 6 Word Memoirs which were inspired by the legend that Ernest Hemingway was once challenged to write a story in only six words, which helped students understand the power of word choice. Finally, we have started our first book, *A Long Walk to Water* by Linda Sue Park. Throughout the book, we will explore how people face adversity and how it impacts character development. Stay tuned for the upcoming Independent Reading Project, which will span most of semester 1!

We had a special guest, Sergeant Perry from Seekonk police, who spoke to the students about the process of collecting evidence for real crimes. Next week, we will begin our first unit of the school year, *Force and Motion*.

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PHYSICAL EDUCATION

Overview:

Physical education is designed to introduce all grades to a variety of team/individual sports and fitness so students can begin to develop positive attitudes towards physical activity and wellness.

Physical Education Dress Code:

For personal hygiene and well-being, all students are required to change out of their school clothing for every Physical Education class utilizing the locker rooms. All students are required to pack proper Physical Education attire and sneakers. Comfortable clothing such as t-shirts, long-sleeve t-shirts, sweatshirts, shorts, and/or athletic pants. Socks should be worn with sneakers.

NOT ALLOWED: Sleeveless shirts, tank tops, crocs, boots, sandals or inappropriate graphics on clothing.

We kicked off the school year by reviewing the Physical Education syllabus and daily grading rubric. The syllabus and grading rubric has been posted to the Physical Education Google classrooms. During the first few weeks, students will participate in a variety of cooperative games designed to help them get to know one another, practice effective communication, and work together toward common goals. These activities emphasize cooperation over competition and give students opportunities to develop trust, problem-solving skills, leadership, and respect for others.
