### BOYS & GIRLS TRACK

The Nicolet Girls and Boys Track teams: The phrase on the back of Coach Parish's State T-shirt said, "Fantastic Four," a perfect theme for James Weseman, Lauren Graham, Olivia Theisen and McKenzie Stacy who competed at the WIAA State Track and Field meet this past weekend. Our only podium medal winner came from Jim who placed 4<sup>th</sup> in a highly contested 800 meters with the time of 1:55.87. His time was just .60 off his new 4<sup>th</sup> all-time on the Nicolet history board. Lauren finished 10<sup>th</sup> in the 100m high hurdle finals, her prelim time of 15.13 now ranks 4<sup>th</sup> all-time on the Nicolet history board. Olivia finished 12<sup>th</sup> in the long jump with a jump of 17-04.25, a mark that moves her to 3<sup>rd</sup> all-time on the Nicolet history board. McKenzie finished 23<sup>rd</sup> in the triple jump with a mark of 33-04.50 just off her personal best of 34-3.5. All four performances capped off a solid season for the team. Jim's appearance in three different State Championships (CC, swimming, track) is unmatched leaving a legacy of being one of the top athletes to compete at Nicolet. His talent will be missed but not as much as his leadership, personality and being an outstanding individual. Lauren, Olivia, and McKenzie all will be back next year to lead their team, determined to be on the podium at State in 2023, and I would not bet against them. As for both the boys' and girls' teams next year, several athletes are primed to have a breakout year making the future look bright for both teams. The Nicolet Girls Soccer team: On Tuesday, the #4 Nicolet Girls Varsity Soccer team began the WIAA playoffs with a regional semifinal game against #13 Cudahy St. Francis. The Knights started the game strong and scored four early goals within the first ten minutes. Goals were scored by Nora McCullough, Mackenzie Barnes (2) and Kayden Schmidt. The Nicolet Girls continued their dominating presence throughout the match and won the game 11-0. Senior Cheyne McCreight came off the bench and scored a hat trick (3) and assisted on one goal. Other scorers were Sarah Klopp, Grace Haraway, Ceci Weseman and Ella Cross (recently brought up from JV for the playoffs). Assisting on the goals were Leah Soyke, Nora McCullough (2), Grace Haraway, Ellie Greco, Madeline Wirth and Elise Mortonson. Taylor Wilson recorded the shutout for the Knights. The victory advanced the Nicolet Varsity team to the WIAA Regional Final versus #5 Wauwatosa East. The teams met one another on Saturday night. The Nicolet Knights started the game strong and at the 7<sup>th</sup> minute, Kayden Schmidt served a beautiful ball from a corner kick that found a determined Kayla Sweet for a powerful header into the back of the net. (That header goal off a corner was Kayla's third for the season.) In the 26<sup>th</sup> minute of the game, Elise Mortonson found Kayden Schmidt just outside the left corner of the 18 yard box and Kayden stuck a low driven ball to the back right corner of the goal. At the half, the Knights were up 2-0. Wauwatosa East came out during the second half and took some of the momentum away from the Knights and were able to score an early goal and close the lead down to 2-1. The Knights slowly worked their way back into the match and at the 64<sup>th</sup> minute, Madigan Johnstone (team MVP) scored from a direct kick from outside the box. Taking a 3-1 lead, the Nicolet Girls played with renewed confidence and energy and were able finish the game off and win 3-1. The win awarded them with a WIAA 2022 Regional Champion Girls Soccer Division 2 title. The Nicolet Girls Soccer team advances to the WIAA Sectional Semifinal game on Wednesday night (June 9, 7:00pm) against conference rival and #1 ranked Whitefish Bay. On Thursday May 26<sup>th</sup> our Regional qualifiers competed against some of the best individuals and relay teams in the State at the WIAA Sectional meet hosted by Arrowhead High School. The Girls team finished in 4<sup>th</sup> and the Boys finished in 8<sup>th</sup> out of the 14 teams that competed. Top three place finishers in each event qualified for the State meet on June 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup>.

Qualifying for State:

- **James Weseman** in the 800m placing 1<sup>st</sup> (1:55.27). His time is the 5<sup>th</sup>-fastest in the state among D1 runners and puts him #4 on Nicolet's all-time list.
- **Lauren Graham** in the 100m High Hurdles placing 3<sup>rd</sup> (15.26). Her time was just off Nicolet's all-time list by .02. After taking a month off to recovery from an injury, Lauren has only had 3 weeks of practice leading up to the Sectional meet. She is seated 7<sup>th</sup> in the prelims which are run on Friday.
- **Olivia Theisen** in the long jump placing 3<sup>rd</sup> (16-0.75). She is a repeat qualifier in the event qualifying in 2021. This is the 4<sup>th</sup> event Olivia has qualified in the last two years.
- **McKenzie Stacy** in the triple jump placing 3<sup>rd</sup> (34-3.50). Her mark is a new Personal Best. This is her first trip competing at State.

Wish these fearsome foursome your best next time you see them. The coaching staff is extremely proud of what they have accomplished so far and looking forward to seeing them compete on Friday June 3<sup>rd</sup> and Saturday June 4<sup>th</sup>.
