

### **Greetings from the AMSA Reproductive Health Project!**

This week <u>ProPublica</u> brought news of the tragic and totally unnecessary deaths of two more women whose doctors were prevented from providing the basic health care they needed to save their lives by the Texas abortion ban:

Josseli Barnica and Nevaeh Crain should be with their families. As should Amber Nicole Thurman and Candi Miller, Georgia women who also died when their doctors were prohibited from providing the abortion care they needed. All of these deaths were completely preventable. Their doctors knew what was needed and should have been allowed to provide the evidence-based medical care required – an abortion.

Their doctors should not have to carry the moral injury of not being able to prevent their deaths. These deaths happened because extremist politicians, believing they know what is best for women, have gerrymandered districts enabling passage of draconian state laws that insert the government and politics into exam rooms and take decision making power away from pregnant patients in consultation with their physicians.

This week we also saw an event that was a near repeat performance of the 1939 pro-Nazi rally held in New York's Madison Square Garden; 20,000 Americans attended that rally — an event largely forgotten from American history. *A Night at the Garden* is an Academy Award Nominated Documentary Short Film, made entirely from archival fragments filmed that night, and shines a light on the enduring power of demagoguery and antisemitism.

This week's news also revealed <u>The mystery of a photographer and his forbidden photos of Nazi-occupied France</u>. The photos show the stark reality of living in wartime Paris under the fascist Nazi regime and serve as a reminder of how fast life can change when authoritarian dictators take control.

This was indeed a heavy week, and the hopes and fears of what next week may bring to our country bodes heavy. Very different paths ahead are being envisioned and offered to Americans. As shared in our recent post <a href="Healing with Art & Activism">Healing with Art & Activism</a>, the power of music to nurture and heal can be inspiring. This is a time for each of us to ask ourselves <a href="Which Side Are You On">Which Side Are You On</a>, a time to think about what fascism means for a nation and her people, and a time to take action. Some have trouble believing <a href="Change is Goin' Come">Change is Goin' Come</a>, but we know <a href="Yes, We Can">Yes, We Can</a> heal this nation. We know <a href="We Who Believe in Freedom Cannot Rest">We Who Believe in Freedom Cannot Rest</a>, we are <a href="The Lighthouse">The Lighthouse</a> in the storm, together we will <a href="Rise Up">Rise Up</a> and <a href="Keep Marching">Keep Marching</a> for Freedom. <a href="Your Voice Matters!">Your Voice Matters!</a> Join us, together we can make change and protect freedom and justice for all.
