- "This is the very ecstasy of love" (Act II, Sc I).
- "Brevity is the soul of wit" (Act II, Scene II).
- "Rich gifts wax poor when givers prove unkind" (Act III, Scene I).
- "Do you think I am easier to be played on than a pipe?" (Act III, Sc. II).
- "I will speak daggers to her, but use none" (Act III, Sc. II).
