In Math...

We begin Module 4, which is an exciting new step for Kindergarten...addition and subtraction to 10! In this module, students will use their knowledge of counting and numbers to solve addition and subtraction equations.

Our goal in this module is for students to gain a deep understanding of number pairs and to become fluent with sums and differences within 10 as these foundational skills are important for 1st Grade.

In Reading...

In CKLA Skills, we will finish Unit 6 and start Unit 7.

Unit 6 goals:

- Match letter sounds to the corresponding letter
- State letter name
- Blend sounds into 3-letter and 4-letter words.
- Read text independently

Unit 7 goals:

- Segment and blend up to 5 sounds
- Learn the /ch/ sound

In CKLA Knowledge, we begin with Unit 7 and end with Unit 8.

Unit 7: Kings and Queens will build understanding of the lifestyle of royalty. We will also read and compare classic nursery rhymes and stories.

Unit 8: Seasons and Weather will build understanding about weather patterns and the four seasons

Science/Social Studies

- In Science, we will learn about movement. We will investigate how things move including pushes, pulls, and changes in motion.
- In Social Studies, we will examine the economic choices that people make. We will study a variety of jobs to identify workers as human resources that produce goods and provide services.
