What is this course about?

This course is designed for those who do not have English as their first language. The main aims are to:

- To provide appropriate academic pathways for English language learners (ELLs) to transition to mainstream English
- To develop the four language skills (Reading, Writing, Listening, Speaking)
- To provide cross-curricular support for ELLs
- To give students opportunities to live and study successfully in Aotearoa, New Zealand.

What sorts of things will I do?

- Read and write simple recounts.
- Read and process simple information texts.
- Write descriptions.
- Write responses to texts you read.
- Discuss current issues.
- Watch and listen to visual texts
- Present information on everyday topics.

Big Ideas

- Language and identity are inextricable, emphasising how our reading and production of texts are informed through our identity and how our identity informs our understanding.
- Making and creating meaning are processes that occur when we interpret, and produce text, allowing the learner to engage in a real way with that text.
- Engaging with text is a source of enjoyment and enrichment.
