
How to find a book in Destiny - our card catalog

Go to the South website: www.nashua.edu/South

Click on Students > Nashua South Media Center to open the South library website.




Scroll down the library home page until you find the Destiny (the card catalog) link:



Select District Destiny to open Destiny and then select Nashua High School South.




From the South page, select *Catalog* and then the *Power* tab for the option which gives you superior searching powers! *Log In* to Destiny, choose the Google login option. If you are already logged into your student Google account, Destiny will not prompt you for your login information. However, if you are not, enter your student login credentials.



In the drop down menu, select an option to define how you want to search. The most frequently used options are *Keyword*, *Title* and *Author*.

You can limit the *Material Type*, for example *Book*.

You can also enter a date in *Publication Year*, for example 2018 to see books newer than that.




Power Search allows you to define your search with more than one parameter. Here I have entered the keywords "civil rights" and "fiction" to limit the results to books that meet both criteria.



The results list displays all the books that meet the search criteria. The title and author of the book is displayed, the location in the library where it is found (*Call #*), a starred review (if someone has reviewed it), and the current availability status (in the library or checked out).



Click on the title link or *Details* to see more information, including a short summary. If you are interested in placing a hold on the book, select *Hold It*. If the book is currently available, the librarian will pull the book off the shelf for you to pick it up at the next designated pick up time.



If you want to find other books that are similar, or on the same topic - you can scroll to the *Explore!* section at the bottom of the page and click on the subject headings. For example, to see *Novels in verse*, click on the link or *Find It* and Destiny returns a new search results list of all the novels in verse in the collection.
