In this doc, you can find instructions/guidelines on how to use the Quastor Anki card deck.

Spaced Repetition has been one of the best things I've implemented in my life and it's allowed me to memorize *whatever* I'd like.

I've been using Anki to accelerate learning around music (memorize guitar fretboard/scales), languages (memorize vocabulary), math (memorize theorems/properties) and much more. It's allowed me to turn memorization into a choice.

In order to help you do the same with system design, I'm creating Anki flashcards on the entire Quastor Archive.

These flashcards are *completely* customizable, so you can modify them any you want.

In this doc, we'll talk about what is SRS, what is Anki and how you can download/modify the cards.

What is Spaced Repetition?

Spaced Repetition is a learning system where you note down whatever you'd like to learn on flashcards. You then study these flashcards and rate each card based on how well you remembered the information.

Then, you use these ratings to determine how long it'll be until you review the card again. If you didn't remember the information, then you'll review the card again immediately. If you easily remembered the information, then you might schedule the card to be reviewed again in a week (or longer).

What is Anki?

Anki is an extremely popular open source tool that automates spaced-repetition. Anki will handle the scheduling/review of cards and you just need to go through the flashcards and rate how well you remembered each one.

Anki with Quastor

<u>Here's the deck</u> where I'll be sharing Anki cards from Quastor's past Pro content and the past Tech summaries.

Each of these cards will contain a link to the full Quastor article so it'll be easy to refresh your memory if you forget.

In order to use this deck, you need to install <u>Anki</u> (it's free). Then, just download the deck and double click on it to open it using the Anki app. The app will automatically import the flashcards.

Anki also has mobile apps so you can review cards from your smartphone.

Modifying Cards

The cards are *fully* modifiable so you can change anything you don't like.
