1. Introduction

2. The Tension in Scripture

- Matthew 7:1-2 — Jesus says, "*Do not judge...*"
- John 7:24 — Jesus also says, "*Judge with righteous judgment...*"
- The Bible appears to both prohibit and permit judgment — how do we reconcile this?

3. Context is Key

- Example: The word "*hit*" has different meanings depending on context (parenting vs. baseball).
- Key Insight: Context helps us understand that Matthew 7 speaks to *religious hypocrisy*, not all judgment.

4. Righteous Judgment Requires Two Things

A. Right Motivation

- We must begin with introspection — why are we judging?
- Watch out for the *yeast of the Pharisees*: religious hypocrisy.

B. Right Metric

- The standard is not personal opinion, but God's righteousness.
- 2 Corinthians 5:21 — Christ's righteousness exchanged for our sin.

5. Judgment Comes with Accountability

- Matthew 7:2 — We will be judged by the same standard.
- 2 Corinthians 5:10 — Our deeds (good and evil) will be judged by Christ.
- Judgment isn't peer-to-peer; it's eternal and eschatological.

6. Jesus' Comical Yet Convicting Illustration

- Matthew 7:3-5 — The splinter and the beam analogy.
- It's foolish to correct others while ignoring our own sin.
- Introspection is a prerequisite for righteous judgment.
- Humility aligns our motives and reminds us we all fall short.

7. A Warning Against Hypocrisy in Practice

- Judgment should come from love and humility — not gossip or religious posturing.

Example: Addressing sexual sin in culture while ignoring internal struggles like pornography.

Statistic: 54% of Christians admit to viewing pornography occasionally — hidden sins within the church must be confronted.

8. The Balance: Avoiding Extremes

A. Extreme #1: Judgmentalism

- Leads to pride, hypocrisy, and spiritual harm.

B. Extreme #2: Naivete

- Matthew 7:6 — Don't toss pearls before pigs.

Ethical relativism is equally dangerous.

We must lovingly protect the community of faith and uphold truth.

- Our foundation is God's righteousness as revealed through Jesus.
We strive together toward holiness, not perfection, but progress.
We don't flippantly judge, nor do we ignore sin.
