- How should freshmen be thinking about summer and their sophomore year?
 - a. Summer between freshman and sophomore year will be least important
 - b. Most important is the summer between junior and senior year
 - c. Second most is the one between sophomore and junior year
 - d. Solomon Consulting helps students learn what they love outside of the classroom (generally research with a college professor or internships or competitive summer programs)
 - e. Better if you are involved in all summers
- 2. Do UCs accept students with a D in any of the subjects?
 - a. Will be challenging based on the UC
 - b. For example, since UCLA is more competitive, will be much harder to get in with a D than a less competitive UC
- 3. Are H4 students allowed for FAFSA?
 - a. Unfortunately not
- 4. Is there a checklist for the college admissions process?
 - a. Solomon Consulting has their own checklist, not sure if there are any common ones out there
 - b. Start with the school list and mapping out strategies for early action and early decision
- 5. How will the pandemic affect college application/admission process for current seniors and Juniors?
 - a. Hard to say for juniors
 - b. Suspecting that for seniors it will be more competitive due to the high number of people who were deferred in the previous year
 - c. Back enough to normalcy, can tell once more regular decision comes back in

 - a. Similar answer to the previous question

- 15. Many Students were struggling due to this Virtual Learning especially AP courses, does Universities make any considerations for that? if a student shows down and with a better up graph in upcoming semesters/year would that be considered positively?
 - a. Data is still coming in for how colleges are going to handle applications during the pandemic
 - b. If it was a case where the virtual learning really affected the student, this would be mentioned somewhere in the application, possibly in the essay, etc.
