

## GUIDELINES FOR WRITING SCIENTIFIC ARTICLES IN THE ARTICULATION E-JOURNAL

**(All text in the Articulation journal uses the font format: Book Antiqua, font advanced scale 100, spacing condensed 0,3 pt, normal position)**

### ARTICLE TITLE

(Book Antiqua size 14, CAPITAL letters, bold, 1 space)

The title must be comprehensive, clear and short, a maximum of 15 words, in the form of a phrase, not a sentence

**(Writer's name)**

**First Author<sup>1\*</sup>, Second Author<sup>2</sup>, Third Author<sup>3</sup>**

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### *Abstract*

**(Book Antiqua, size 11, bold):**

*(Book Antiqua, size 11, Italic, single space)*

*Abstract is a brief overview of the whole article, containing the discussed main issues, the purpose for the study, how the research is carried out, the research method, and the research results. Abstract is written in one paragraph consists of 150-200 words, without references / citations (Book Antiqua, size 11, spacing 1)*

*Keywords (Book Antiqua, size 11, capital letter at the beginning of the word, thick, spacing 1): Containing 3-5 words or phrases, without conjunction and, and without a period in the end (Book Antiqua, size 11, spacing 1)*

*Keywords (Book Antiqua, size 11, bold): 3 – 5 words or phrases (Book Antiqua, size 11, Italic, single space)*

### **1. Introduction**

**(Book Antiqua 12, capital only at the beginning of the word, bold, without periods)**

The introduction contains: (1) background of the problem, (2) explanation of the problem phenomenon and problem formulation (preferably a problem formulation that is the focus

of the research, (3) aims and benefits of the research, (4) review of literature relevant to the research and theoretical framework or The approach is appropriate to this research. All of this is supported by literature references in the form of research results, textbooks or related journals, with relatively recent publication years. Make sure that 80% of the references are publications from the last 10 years and 80% come from primary reference sources. The reference or source referred to or quoted must be written in a description of the article accompanied by the author's name, year of publication, and page on the reference. In this introductory section, subchapters are not used and the first paragraph is written aligned to the left introductory chapter title.

The next paragraph uses a special first line paragraph format of 0.8 cm.  
(Book Antiqua, size 12, single space)

## **2. Method**

**(Book Antiqua 12, capital at the beginning of the word, bold)**

The method contains the nature or type of research, data, data sources, data collection techniques, data collection instruments, data collection procedures, and data analysis methods. The first paragraph is written aligned left, straight with the method chapter title.

The next paragraph uses a special first line paragraph format of 0.8 cm.  
(Book Antiqua12, 1st space)

## **3. Results and Discussion**

**(Book Antiqua 12, capitalize only at the beginning of words except the word task, bold)**

The results and discussion must answer the research problems and objectives. The first paragraph of the results and discussion is written straight with the chapter title.

The next paragraph uses a special first line paragraph format of 0.8 cm.  
(Book Antiqua, size 12, single space)

### **3.1 Subbab**

**(Book Antiqua 12, capitals at the beginning of words except the word task, bold)**

Results and discussion can be presented in the form of subsequent subchapters, using numbers (digits, maximum four digits, for example 3.1.2.2). Subchapter titles are written in capital letters at the beginning of the word except for the word task. The first paragraph in each subchapter is written aligned left, straight with the initial number in the subchapter digitization.

The next paragraph uses a special first line paragraph format of 0.8 cm.  
(Bokk Antiqua, size 12, space 1)

### **Tables, Graphs, Figures and/or Photos**

Tables, graphs, diagrams, pictures and/or photos (if any) are numbered, titled and written above the table (or other items). Tables, graphs, figures and/or photos are numbered in the order they appear. Tables and figures must be clearly legible and can be printed well because the manuscript will be printed in black and white format. Including tables/data that are too long (more than one page) should be avoided so that the readability and neatness of the writing is maintained. Images, tables, graphs, photos should be placed as close as possible to the related text. Try not to "re-read" the table in

analyzing or describing the table, but analyze why the numbers, graphs, diagrams or images appear/are there. Also try to make sure the table only uses horizontal lines or minimizes the use of vertical lines. Each table column must be given a header. Example:

Apart from that, avoid references from pages on the internet.

Bibliography and citations use Mendeley references in APA style, as follows.

Direct quotation from the source text of more than three lines, written in its own paragraph with Book Antiqua font size 11, 1 space, identification left 0.8 cm, right 0 cm. The reference source is written as follows (Suwondo, 2014: 25).

#### **4. Conclusion**

##### **(Book Antiqua 12, Bold)**

Conclusions must answer the problem and research objectives. The conclusion is not a summary and is also not a rewrite of the discussion. The conclusion is written in the form of a narrative description, not details with numbers or letters. The first paragraph is written aligned left, straight with the chapter title.

The next paragraph uses a special first line paragraph format of 0.8 cm. (Book Antiqua 12, 1st space)

#### **Bibliography**

(Book Antiqua 12, Capitalize only the first letter of the word, bold)

80% of the literature referred to is made from publications from the last 10 years (except classical references which are used as historical study material). 80% of all library sources

come from primary reference sources (research results, ideas, theories or concepts that have been published in national and international journals). Apart from that, avoid references from pages on the internet.

The bibliography and citation list consists of a minimum of 20 references using Mendeley references in APA style, as follows.

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
