

Google Search Challenge

Task:

Use [Google Drive](#) to create a Google Presentation that documents how you and your partner solved the following problem:

You and your partner are newspaper reporters. An anonymous individual sent you four photos and you want to use these photos to research an article that you plan to write. Using the power of Google's search features, determine the location and date of these photos - **be as specific as possible**. You will create a presentation that documents the steps you took to determine the location and date of the photos and use all the tools at your disposal to provide multiple pieces of evidence that **JUSTIFY** the location and date of the photos. The team with the "best" justification and most overwhelming evidence will win a small prize.

Presentation Requirements:

- Describe your problem-solving process. Your presentation should explain how you found the correct answer to this question and the problem(s) that you experienced along the way. To do this, you should explain:
 - What search terms that you used
 - What Google search features you used
 - How your search terms pointed you in a new direction and/or how you knew they did not work
 - How you "chunked" the problem.
- Your presentation should be somewhere between 60-90 seconds long. Each partner should play an equal role in the speaking portion of the presentation.
- Your presentation may NOT include any written text with the presentation - Only images. Ensure that you are using images that help "tell the story" of your problem solving process. Hint - Screenshots and using shapes may help...see the directions at the bottom of the page for directions on how to take a screenshot, insert a screenshot into your presentation, and highlight a specific area of text.




Google Search Strategies	<p>We provided a detailed and correct analysis of how to solve the problem.</p> <p>Our detailed analysis included an explanation of our search terms, use of Google search features, and an explanation of how we “chunked” the problem.</p>	<p>We provided an analysis of how to solve the problem.</p> <p>However, in some instances, we failed to explain or incorrectly used search terms, Google search features, and “chunking” procedures.</p>	<p>We struggled to provide an analysis of how to solve the problem.</p> <p>We frequently misused or failed to explain our search terms, use of Google search features, and “chunking” procedures.</p>




Google Presentation Instructions and Submission:

<p>1.</p>	<p>Create your presentation. Click on “New” then “Google Slides.”</p>	
<p>2.</p>	<p>Click the “Share” button> Get Shareable link.</p> <p>Ensure that “Anyone at St. Catherines” can comment. Copy this link!</p> <p>Share the document with your partner. Make sure she “can edit.”</p>	
<p>3.</p>	<p>Click this link. Paste the link to your presentation into the appropriate section of the form. Make sure to include all of the information, including your name, your partner’s name, and your block.</p>	

Screenshots and Highlighting Text:

<p>1.</p>	<p>Use the directions on the right to take a screenshot on the Chromebook.</p>	<p>Let's say you need to take a snap of your entire screen. To do this you press the 'Ctrl' and 'Window Switcher' keys at the same time:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p> <p>If you just want to capture a specific area of the screen just add shift to the key combo, like so:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"></p>
<p>2.</p>	<p>In order to insert an image into your presentation, click “insert>image.”</p> <p>You can resize the image by clicking and dragging on the corners of the image.</p>	
<p>3.</p>	<p>Insert shapes into a Google Presentation in order to highlight specific words, images, or features within your images that you will use to tell the “story” of your search.</p>	
<p>4.</p>	<p>To change the details of a shape click the shape.</p> <p>Then - You can use the fill color, line color, and line weight options to change those details.</p>
