



Filming Your Video

1. Set your phone video camera app to the lowest resolution you can (e.g. VGA: to make the video upload smaller and to assure your only having to upload one video). Leaning your phone against something should be enough to film or you can buy a cheap small tripod like this ([click here](#)) which can be bought at Walmart, sometimes a dollar store or a like business.
2. When filming your videos **ASSURE:**
 - a. **You and one other student are in the video.**
 - b. **That you speak loud enough so you can be heard when we watch it.**
 - c. The **camera should be off to one side or done in a way so you are not focused on it.** So don't film yourself (and student) looking directly at the camera.
 - d. The syllabus you send to us and video **MUST** match up (**do not modify your sequence after it has been given feedback and been approved**; as doing that makes it impossible for us to follow the video with the sequence)
 - e. **You should be face-to-face with the student** both again in the frame, so we can:
 - i. See how you looking at the student(s),
 - ii. See what your body is doing when you're instructing, and,
 - iii. So we can see you modifying/using props with the student(s).

Uploading Your Video To Youtube

1. Once you have videoed your class, upload it to Youtube.
2. Signup (if you don't have an account) and then sign into your YouTube account.
3. Click on the Upload at the top of the page it will say: create a video or post
4. Upload the video
5. Title it with your first initial and last name, denote if it is a practice or certification class, and for what course e.g J. Smith. Practice Class. 200 Hour Online.
6. Once it is uploaded, you should for visibility choose **unlisted**, when you do that anyone with the video link can see your video and so your class is not viewable to everyone on Youtube.
7. Notify us with a link to it, once you have uploaded it successfully for us to review it.
