




## Guidelines For Creating A Grid & A Moderated Topic in Flipgrid





## **CREATING A MODERATED TOPIC IN FLIPGRID**

1. Login to Flipgrid using your Hartford Public Schools Google Account.



2. Once inside, locate your Grid and click on it.





6. Under Topic Status, turn "Video Moderation" on, as below. This will ensure that any videos posted will be hidden from students until you activate them. You can also determine whether you want students to reply to one another via video.
