Complete the following programming exercise to show us some of your code! This exercise is based on work that DataMade does every day: pulling data from the web, debugging tricky code, and presenting information to the world.

There's no time limit, but don't feel the need to go over the top with your submission. We expect this task to take about two hours to complete, but it could take more or less time depending on your familiarity with Django and JavaScript. When you're all set, share your code with us as a repository on GitHub or GitLab.

We'll be evaluating whether the code works, as well as its quality. Before submitting, make sure that your code does what you expect it to do, that it's clean and neat enough to meet your standards, and that you've provided us some instructions on how to run it.
