<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Also called “online or distance learning” • Peck Schools teacher, counselor, and administrator support and monitoring • Parents are learning coaches and play an active role • Work from home/alternative area with internet service • Scheduled meetings and contact with school personnel and potentially other students • District provided devices will be available • K-3 students will have workbooks to go along with virtual content • Special education services will continue virtually • Students may participate in athletics, extracurricular activities, and other district-provided services 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Also called “traditional” • Fantastic face to face instruction with teachers • Administrator and counseling support • Support staff in elementary classrooms • Virtual content will be provided if school is to close for any reason • Follow Guidelines of MI Return to Learn Roadmap • All special education services provided in person • Students may participate in athletics, extracurricular activities, and other district-provided services 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Also called “blended learning” • Combination of in-person and virtual instruction that is tailored to families’ needs • Special education services provided in a way that best fits families’ needs • Students may participate in athletics, extracurricular activities, and other district-provided services

***Homeschooling is not an option offered through any school. Homeschooling is when parents vet, purchase, and teach curriculum to their children outside of a school setting. This is the only option that does not permit students to participate in athletics, extra curricular activities, and other district provided services.**
