- **Affective Statement**

Teacher/Staff requests a

- -Restorative Chat
- Notifies office and waits for Admin to determine action/pending investigation

Admin / Facilitator comes to the classroom to meet with student in a Restorative Chat

Step 3

Admin / facilitator brings student back to teacher/staff and facilitates a Restorative Chat together to resolve conflict and repair harm.

Together determine any restoration, sanction or interventions needed

AND

-Admin completes Major Incident in Powerschools & follows up with teacher
