Essential EDC Checklist for Dog Owners/Trainers/Walkers

Everyone's dog-walking experience is going to be a little different.

Many different variables may come into play such as:

- Area (neighborhood, park, etc.)
- Dog walker (you)
- Off-leash dogs (be on high alert!)
- Other dog-walkers
- Dog body language

The key here is to STAY VIGILANT!

- Don't let your guard down.
- Be prepared
- Be aware of your surroundings

Here is a very basic EDC list and some reasons for carrying these particular items: (Your dog should be on a strong leash at all times when out walking).

Gloves

- Hand protection
- Grip on leash
- Picking up dirty items

Keys

No one home to open the door

Poop bags

- Common courtesy
- Don't be "that guy"

Knife

- You never know when you need to cut something loose.
- A knife for self-defense should ONLY be used as a LAST RESORT. Not recommended.

Wallet

- Business cards (you never know)
- ID card
- Money

Phone

- Call for help
- Taking a photo

Pepper spray

- If the attacker can't see, they can't fight... usually. Not 100% effective, but still a great go-to self-defense tool.
- Fits easily into your pocket. Carry in-hand when you sense a high-alert situation.

Stun gun (my personal favorite)

- The sound alone will scare off most dogs.
- Usually no contact is needed with the animal.
- If necessary, the device will deliver enough pain to send the attacking-dog running, but will not be physically harmed.

Here are other EDC items that other dog trainers and walkers keep in their fanny-packs, pockets, or whatever they use to carry their gear.

Remember, it's all a matter of preference, and seeing what works best for your situation.

This list should give you more than enough choices:

- 1. Treat pouch
- 2. Brand (your business name on your shirt)
- 3. Whistle
- 4. Dog clicker
- 5. Foldable food/water bowl
- 6. Headlamp
- 7. Flashlight
- 8. Pen
- 9. Batteries
- 10. Collar w/ID
- 11. Water bottle
- 12. First aid kit (small)
- 13. Hand sanitizer
- 14. Emergency-contact card
- 15. Current rabies vaccination records
- 16. Towel for your pooch to lay on.
- 17. Lighter
