[INTRODUCE YOURSELF HERE.] I am writing to share my concerns about Senate Bill 404, which undermines the voices of thousands of Californians who are directly impacted by the health, environmental, and quality-of-life impacts of the state's large metal shredding facilities.

As written, this bill is deeply problematic in many ways:

- SB 404 redefines many of the industry's toxic emissions as non-hazardous in direct contradiction of scientific evidence, including Light Fibrous Material consisting of synthetic fabric and carpet fibers and metallic particles, and shredded aggregate containing toxic heavy metals like lead, copper, and zinc. These materials are flammable and toxic enough to meet the legal definition for hazardous waste, and have already contaminated the surrounding soil and groundwater of metal shredder-adjacent communities like West Oakland.
- SB 404 effectively strips local, regional, and state agencies of the ability to regulate California's metal shredding industry and allow the industry to self-regulate by merely submitting self-written, unenforceable "plans" without adequate monitoring, record keeping, and reporting. Given the industry's decades-long history of consistent legal and environmental violations and regulatory noncompliance, this approach is essentially putting the fox in charge of the henhouse.
- SB 404 directly undermines the public review process for impacted communities across the state. It lacks meaningful input from the communities most impacted by these facilities.

I respectfully urge you to reject this bill.
