CAMP ENTERPRISE

Camp Enterprise has been a program administered by the Rotary Clubs of Edina and funded by the generosity of local Rotary Clubs throughout central and southern MN, including



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Bloomington. The program has been in existence for over 50 years.

In 2025, Camp Enterprise is being held **in-person at Camp Courage in Maple Lake, MN from Nov 6-8, 2025**. We recruit high school **juniors and seniors** to participate in the leadership program and team them up with students from across MN. They form Teams of 8 students and are presented 1 of 4 business cases for which they will form a business to solve the unique market problem/opportunity.

They will develop a business plan and presentation in order to present to a panel of venture capitalists for a \$5M investment. The students will be provided training and development on leadership, collaboration, innovation/ideation, ethics, and presentation skills during Camp Enterprise. **All of this is at no cost to the students. Transportation from the Twin Cities, room, board, and all the programming are supported by your local Rotary Clubs. The students are also eligible for one of 5 \$1,000 merit scholarships that they can use for any future educational need post high school.**

Please note that any high school junior or senior, regardless of their interest in or participation in business or entrepreneurial related classes or programs is eligible for Camp Enterprise.

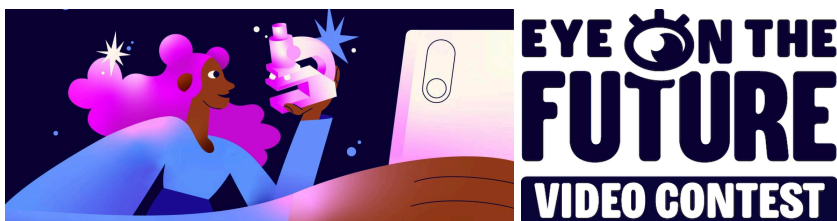

Each year there's a new theme for Scrubs Camp with some core sessions being repeated year to year. Students attending camp this year may be exposed to slightly different types of labs and equipment/instruments than students who attended the year before.

Program schedules will also vary to showcase the resources available at the institution hosting the camp. The typical camp experience will expose students to a variety of lab equipment like microscopes, slides, specimens, along with simulation mannequins, and surgery tools.

We also offer our Scrubs Online program, which is a snapshot of what students would experience at in-person camps.

 - June 9-12, 2025

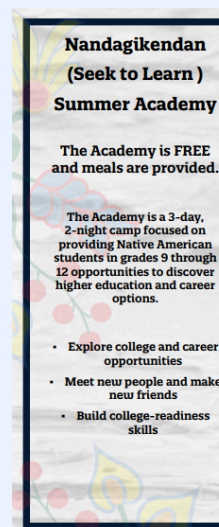
