The sanctuary banners will be put

up for Advent. Decorating for Christmas will happen Friday November 28th and once again, we will be blessed with a live tree from the Johnson property.

You will notice: new furniture in the Compassion Room; cleanup and different setup for the Children's Room; a new baby wall change-tables in both bathrooms to allow more room for mobility; upgraded lighting in the entire sanctuary and the hall to classrooms.

Our costs to date are estimated at \$6,000.00 over budget (some actual costs haven't been received).
