I need to apologize... I jumped the gun a little on Twitter I shared two updates recently. One on Adobe Spark and the other about Google Expeditions.

Both made announcements and BOTH are saying SOON!

Spark is soon going to allow for 13 and under students to use their GSuite or Microsoft accounts to log in. Expeditions is going to allow you to make your own VR expeditions

Expeditions announcement being able to make your own. But only in beta right now

Let's talk screen capturing. I use this EVERY DAY

- Macs: Press Shift-Command (\mathcal{H}) -3 & 4
- PC's you now have your own built in Windows program called Snipping Tool
- Chromebooks: Hold down the "Ctrl" and "Shift" keys at once, then press the "switch window" button. An image is then saved as a PNG file in your "Downloads" folder.

But what about recording video? I am doing this more and more on a regular basis

I have two recommendations

1) Screencastify:

- Free version has 10 minute video length limit
- 50 videos / month
- Screencastify watermark
