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What are we studying?

US History II should pick up from US I. We will be starting at the turn of the century, looking at the Spanish American War and continuing with Teddy Roosevelt and his policies. We will cover as close as we can to today. Current Events will also be a part of this course.

How are we graded?

Grading is done on a total points scale. For example, an assignment can be worth 10 points, 20 points or 150 points depending on its importance. At the end of the quarter your points will be added up and divided by the total number of points for the term. Quarter grades will be based on the following:

- Class assignments and homework
- Quizzes and Tests
- Writing assignments
- Oral Presentations/Reading/Research Skills projects
- Class Participation Grade (see expectation sheet for details)

Reading/Critical Thinking Skills

We will be doing more reading, notetaking, paragraph and essay writing. I will guide you through this process and am here to help. If you are ever feeling overwhelmed please talk to me. You need to look at this positively - as there cannot be one right or wrong answer, but rather expressing YOUR opinion and using ACCURATE historical facts and information to back it up. We will do short writing assignments. Class will be looking and reading something together and pulling out what is important, why is it relevant, what is its cause and effect. There will also be times that we give you information/background and it is important that you pay attention and participate - that way it will not be the me talking at you.

Homework/Where to find assignments

There will be homework assignments and it is important that they be completed. Much of it will be reading and that will apply to what we do in class together. I assign homework to prepare you for the class, discussions and assignments. It will make for a more interesting and diverse class. Homework is due the day after it is assigned. LATE HOMEWORK WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. If you are absent, you have one day to make it up. Homework assignments, study guides, class notes, etc. are easily accessed via the blog or google classroom.

Classroom Expectations - What I expect from you

During class...

- *raise your hands if you would like to speak during class*
- **respect** everyone and everything in class -- including classmates and teachers, books and other materials that we use
- *participate in class discussions*
- *you CAN eat and drink, but please CLEAN UP after yourselves and don't make a mess or I will have to suspend that policy*
- *please do not use your cell phones in class - If after a warning you are using your phone, it will be taken*
- *please do not use iPads for anything off topic.*
