# How to attend a free amateur radio exam and get an FCC license

## Getting an FRN

This is the first step that you need in applying for the FCC amateur radio licensing exam. If you are upgrading your license, you will most likely have an FRN already. If this is your first time, then read on. Getting the FRN can be confusing at first, because of the complicated nature of the FCC CORES website.

This requires that you have a U.S. address. A postal address/PO box will do. Refer to online tools to determine how to get an online PO box. <a href="https://usaddress.com">https://usaddress.com</a> is a good example.



Licenses are not mailed, so the address is mostly just used for regulatory purposes, and if there is ever a need for regulatory letters.


- 1. On the CORES website, click on Register <a href="https://apps2.fcc.gov/fccUserReg/pages/createAccount.htm">https://apps2.fcc.gov/fccUserReg/pages/createAccount.htm</a> to create a username.
- 2. Fill it in with your desired valid username (which is your email) and other details. Check your email inbox for the activation link.


3. Once you activate your account via email, click on GO TO CORES. Then create a new FRN.

4. Fill it in with relevant details. Register as an individual. Indicate that your contact address is within the US or territories.





Indicate your name. If you don't have an SSN, leave it blank, but say that The Individual is Foreign.

In your registration, use your US address. If you don't have a US address yet, you may use a post office (PO) box address. You may get a free PO box address from <a href="https://usaddress.com">https://usaddress.com</a>.

5. On the next page, take note of your FRN (an example is in the red box below). This is what you will provide us prior to your exam.

## Pre-registering for your slot

This makes it easy for us to prepare the paperwork in advance, so that during the exam session itself, you only have to worry about answering the test, and we only have to worry about checking and filing. 

Note that not all of the information there is relevant since we will be doing the exam differently with Laurel VE (the above guide outlines online testing with GLAARG, a different volunteer examiner coordinator that offers virtual testing).

Here is a <u>recommended study method</u> by Noji, KN0JI.


We also recommend going to <a href="https://hamstudy.org">https://hamstudy.org</a> for study resources. We like this resource because it provides both the test pool (yes, the exact items in the test) and an explanation behind the theory or the practical applications of the item. You can click on "Technician" for the entry-level exam.



Try the study mode. The website will show you questions, which are from the actual exam pool. The exam itself will be from random items taken from the exact same question pool.




After you answer, the site will show you the correct answer.



You may click on the "i" icon to view an explanation of that item, the theory behind it, or the computations.

These two answers are clearly incorrect. A grounded wrist strap is for use on electronics and won't help when working on a tower. Insulating the base won't stop lightning strikes and eliminates the grounding system that protects the tower. The only answer that is an important safety precaution is to look for and stay clear of overhead electrical wires. The tower, guy wires and you should be well clear of any overhead electrical wires. Next

For most questions, two out of four are clearly wrong answers. There is ONE correct answer, but often ONE other "distractor", which is designed to test your proficiency and knowledge amidst potential confusion.

## Try the practice test

When you are already confident in your review, you may choose to take a practice test. The Technician test involves 35 questions. You need to have at least 27 items correct to pass the exam.

You may take the practice test as many times as you want or need, to gauge your progress and improvement in the review.

If you are confident enough, you may also wish to try the General and even the Extra exams.

For upgrading, it's the same case with the General test – you need 27 correct out of 35 questions.

Meanwhile, the Amateur Extra test consists of 50 items. You need at least 37 correct answers to pass.

You may choose to take all exams in one session if you wish to.

Be sure to save screenshots of your exam ratings or sign up for a hamstudy account, so you can keep track of your progress through time.

#### The test

The actual test is conducted by at least 3 volunteer examiners. Prior to the test, you will need to have an FRN or FCC Reference Number, as described above.

We shall keep you posted regarding the exact instructions, dates, and times for Laurel VEC - Pilipinas Testing Group exams.

The Laurel VE exam itself is free, although the FCC will charge you \$35 for the licensing fee once your results have been submitted. Licenses are valid for 10 years and can be renewed thereafter. FCC will notify you via email that a passing result has been submitted to the system. You can pay the fee via debit card, credit card, etc.


Once FCC receives your payment, it will process your license and email you with a callsign and the PDF file of your official license.

Any subsequent upgrade of the license class will be free. Renewal after 10 years will incur a \$35 fee. You may also apply for a custom/vanity callsign, but applications are also charged \$35.


### Once you get FCC confirmation

There is a \$35 application fee that you need to pay once FCC sends you a notification that the VEC has submitted your documents. You will need to login to the CORES in order to pay this fee.



The email will include an attached PDF with instructions on how to pay. Click the link and follow these to login to the FCC system. It's basically the same login as your CORES above.

The Easiest option is to click on the link provided and log in using your FRN and the password you setup earlier. This is the second option.

As an alternative, you can log in using your FRN username (email, or the first option above) and look for the payment link.

- 6.1. **Submit payment electronically**. Payment can be made by credit/debit card or by bank withdrawal.




You can pay this using credit card or other methods.



Once you get the payment confirmation, you will need to wait until FCC processes your license.



If it is a new license, you may have to wait 24-48 hours after paying before your license and callsign appear on the database. You will get an email notification.



You can download the Official Copy of your license from CORES or through the link provided. You may also find a reference copy that you can share.

There are two versions of the license in PDF: the Official Copy (for your own private records only), and a Reference Copy that you may share and which others can also freely download from the database. You can download these at any time from within FCC's system.

Upgrades do not incur a fee. Upgrades usually take faster to reflect on the database after the results are submitted to the FCC via Laurel VEC.

## Getting a reciprocal license

## Advanced Option: How to get a vanity callsign

Once you have obtained your FCC license, you can apply for a vanity callsign.

 Before anything, you want to check your options if valid or available. Be sure to apply for callsigns that are authorized with your license and class. Check <a href="http://ae7q.com">http://ae7q.com</a> for resources on availability. The site also tells you what kind of callsign you can apply for. Normally, any class can apply for a 2x3 callsign or 1x3 callsign (with 1 letter, zone number prefix, then 3 letter suffix, like N2RAC). Amateur Extra can apply for 2x1 (e.g., WT8C) callsigns, etc.

You can use the lookup to check if the callsign you want is available. You can apply for up to 25, so you have several options in case the primary choice is not available.

An expired callsign is usually back in the pool two years after expiry. Some callsigns might have never been assigned at all.



You will then be asked to confirm your information on the next screen, as well as respond to the "felony" question.

9. You will then be asked to certify if all the information is correct. This includes a notice for fee details. You will then need to pay the fee to submit your application.

10. You will need to wait 18 days for FCC to act on the application. This is to ensure that all applications are accounted for. If there are others who apply for the same vanity callsign

at the same time as you, FCC will raffle it to determine who will be granted the application. The \$35 fee is an application fee and is nonrefundable.
