Paint Medium

Choose **one type** of paint medium for this class:

- Acrylics
- Watercolors

Do not purchase supplies for more than one paint type. Watercolor supply information appears below, after the Acrylic section.

If you choose Acrylics:

You will need six 2-ounce tubes of paint in the following colors:

- Titanium White – Bright white (like typing paper)
- Cadmium Yellow – Yellow (like a lemon)
- Naphthol Red – Bright red (like a fire engine)
- Phthalo Green – Dark green (like a cucumber)
- Ultramarine Blue – Deep blue (like a night sky)
- Mars Black or Ivory Black

Brushes

Brushes may be made from natural hair or synthetic fibers. Natural hair is preferred, but synthetics are widely used and more affordable. Sets may be more cost-effective and offer a variety of sizes.

Recommended brush types:

- Small round brush (comes to a point)
- Medium flat brush (square top)
- Filbert brush (great for blending)
- Large wash brush

Canvas Options

- You can use canvas boards or panels – get a total of six
- Average size: 9 inches by 12 inches

Additional Supplies (Acrylic)

- Standard size palette knife
- Roll of wax paper
- Painter's tape
- Two plastic or paper cups
- Roll of paper towels

If you choose Watercolors:

Paint options - choose either:

- A set of watercolor pencils, or
- A set of watercolor paints in small tubes

Watercolor Brushes

Watercolor brushes are designed to hold water and paint efficiently. You can purchase brushes individually or as a set.

You should have:

- At least one very small brush (comes to a point)
- Three to four additional brushes in small, medium, and large sizes (based on your paper size)

Examples:

- Spotter brush
- Rigger brush
- Round brush
- Flat brush
- Mop or oval brush
- Large wash brush

Note:

- Best quality: sable brushes
- Budget-friendly: synthetic fiber brushes (made from polyester or nylon)

Watercolor Paper

Use watercolor blocks or pads (about 15 sheets) in one of the following sizes:

- 4 inches by 6 inches
- 6 inches by 9 inches
- 9 inches by 12 inches

Additional Supplies (Watercolor)

- Watercolor palette or well
- Painter's tape
- Two plastic or paper cups
- Roll of paper towels
