Regulations of the final control for 4th year students of medical faculties in 2021-2022 academic year

The final control consists of three parts:

- 1. Computer testing
- 2. Oral examination
- 3. Clinical cases

During the computer testing, a student receives 30 questions and select the correct answers. Computer testing is performed on the Likar platform. The student can get a maximum of 20 points for computer-based testing. You have 15 minutes to provide answers.

The oral part of the final exam is organized in a group in Skype or Zoom. Each student should introduce himself and present to the camera a document proving his identity. During the oral examination, the examiner asks the student 1 question from the List of questions in neurology for the oral examination in clinical neurology. If necessary, the examiner can ask an additional clarifying question within the question that the student received.

After the question, the student receives two consecutively clinical tasks, which are demonstrated on the screen by the examiner and the student immediately orally answers the questions posed in each task.

The total score for the final control consists of the sum of points, obtained at each part, and can be a maximum of 120 points. The total number of points in the discipline is the sum of points for current studying and received at the final control.
