Lanyard Replacement Procedure

This school year, we are implementing a new procedure regarding lanyard replacements to ensure that all students are in proper uniform at the start of the school day. It is your responsibility to ensure that you arrive at school in full uniform, including your lanyard, before the beginning of the school day. You will automatically receive an infraction if you arrive after 9:00 AM to request a replacement lanyard To encourage responsible care of your lanyard, we have implemented a tiered pricing structure. The first five lanyards/IDs you buy will be \$10. After 5 the price increases. 1-5 Lanyards: \$10 each 6-10 Lanyards: \$15 each 11-15 Lanyards: \$20 each 20+ Lanyards: \$25 each Please be mindful of this pricing structure and take care to keep your lanyard secure.

Calculator Loaner Program

Lost and Found

Lost and found items like clothing, water bottles, lunch boxes, and personal items are located in the Student Life Center (SLC) near Student Services. Other items like phones, headphones, watches, jewelry, etc...may be in Student Services.

Injuries and Dress Code

It is our expectation that all students are in dress code. If there is a medical reason that a student is unable to wear our school pants, a student must have medical documentation and/or input from our Cathedral's medical staff. With the proper documentation/input, a student can "borrow"/"check out" a pair of Student Services approved Cathedral sweatpants.

Outside Deliveries

Students are not permitted to have outside deliveries (DoorDash, Uber Eats, GrubHub, Starbucks, etc...) prior to the end of the school day (3:30pm). If a student is unable to get lunch for any reason, students should check in with Student Services.

Nurse Clinic Policy

If a student needs to see the nurse, they must first receive permission from their teacher. The nurse will assess the student's needs and only allow a student to remain in the clinic for no more than 20 minutes. If a student feels they can return to class, the nurse will release the student with a pass back to their classroom. If the student can not return to class after 20 minutes in the clinic, the student will be sent home. The clinic does not have space to allow students to remain longer than a 20 minute period. Parents or guardians must come to Cathedral once contacted.

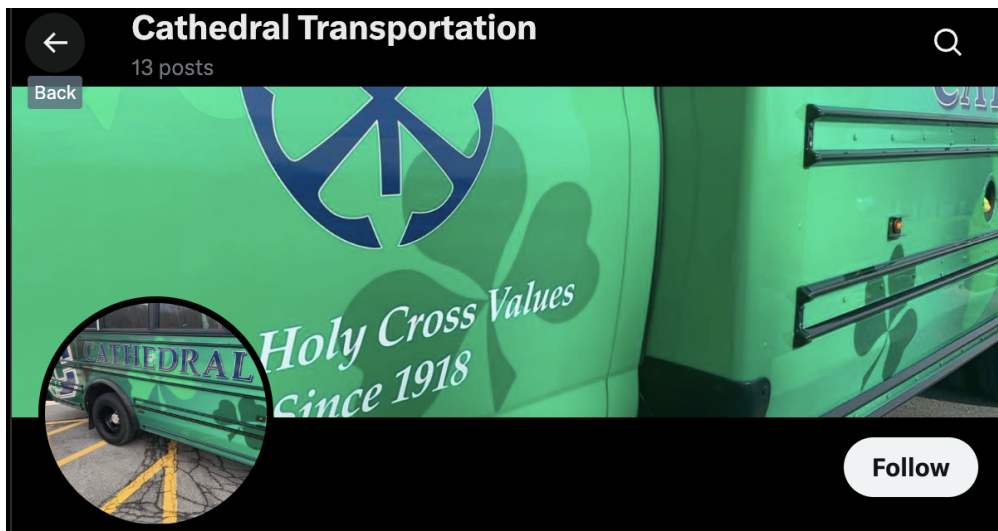

Leaving The School Grounds with Permission

NO STUDENTS SHOULD LEAVE CAMPUS FOR ANY REASON AT ANY POINT OF THE SCHOOL DAY, unless a parent/guardian calls in and a student checks out properly from the attendance desk.

LEAVING THE SCHOOL GROUNDS FOR OFF-CAMPUS BUSINESS

Parents/guardians should report early departures via SafeArrival before 9:30 a.m.
Permission for leaving the school grounds will be given to the student by the attendance office via email. If a student fails to check out or back in they may receive an infraction for not following procedures, as the school is liable for all students.

LEAVING THE SCHOOL GROUNDS DUE TO ILLNESS

Students who become ill or injured during the school day should report to the nurse's office. Students must communicate with an adult in order to miss class time. If a student is unable to remain at school, school personnel will contact the parent/guardian. Students are not permitted to call or text message a parent/guardian to go home. The parent/guardian is responsible for picking up the student as soon as possible. A student may NOT drive or walk home unless parent/guardian permission is received.
